SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2583 by House Committee on Aging and Long Term Care

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2583 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2583 would require any offender who is required to register under the Kansas Offender Registration Act who is applying for admission to a licensed adult care home to inform the home of the offender's status and to inform the registering law enforcement agency in the jurisdiction of the offender's presence at the adult care home. Beginning July 1, 2013, the bill would require adult care homes to provide any prospective resident or their legal guardian, current resident or their legal guardian, and the adult care home employees a written notice of the residence or discharge of a registered offender. Finally, the bill would require adult care homes to conspicuously post a notice of the KBI website and any internet website sponsored or created by the registering law enforcement agency of the county in which the adult care home is located for the purpose of locating registered offenders.

Passage of HB 2583 could have a negligible fiscal effect for adult care homes that are required to provide written notifications to employees and residents.
