# SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 2069

### As Amended by Senate Committee on Reapportionment

# Brief\*

Senate Sub. for Sub. for HB 2069 would redraw the state's 40 Senate (Map Name: Buffalo 20) and ten State Board of Education (Map Name: Buffalo 20-SBOE) districts.

The ideal size of each Senate district is 70,986 people. In Buffalo 20, all 40 districts range from 5 percent under to 5 percent over the ideal district size. To account for population gains and loses throughout the state, the map would combine the 36th and 40th Districts. The new 36th District would be drawn in Johnson County.

Each State Board of Education district would be comprised of four whole, contiguous Senate districts.

All districts were built using counties, precincts, and census blocks.

The bill would be in effect upon publication in the Kansas Register.

# Background

During the 2012 Session, the Kansas Legislature will redraw congressional, legislative, and State Board of Education districts. The congressional districts are redrawn using 2010 Census data. The legislative and State Board of Education districts are redrawn using adjusted census data provided by the Secretary of State's Office.

The Senate Committee on Reapportionment removed the contents of HB 2069, a bill originally dealing with judiciary policy, and inserted Buffalo 20.

The substitute bill was rereferred from the Senate Committee of the Whole to the Senate Committee on Reapportionment for the purpose of considering Buffalo 20-SBOE.

The fiscal note on the original bill is no longer applicable.
