SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE BILL NO. 118

As Amended by Senate Committee on Ways and Means

Brief*

SB 118 would increase certain fees credited to the Board of Barbering Fee Fund and create a chair lease license fee.

Background

The executive director of the Board of Barbering testified to support the bill. The Board of Barbering executive director stated that the last time the Legislature increased the statutory maximum was in 2003 and the last time the Board raised fees was in 2007. The new chair lease fees currently are being charged by the Board at \$25 but are not in statute. However, the new chair lease fees are mentioned in the Kansas Administrative Regulations 61-4-2. The bill would put these fees in statute, and the Board has indicated it will continue to charge \$25. No neutral or opposition testimony was offered.

These fees are deposited to the Board of Barbering Fee Fund, and the balance is used by the Board to properly administer the laws which the Board is directed to enforce.

The Committee on Ways and Means amended three statutory maximums in the original bill. The statutory maximums for the annual barber shop inspection fee and the fee for restoration of an expired chair lease license if the licensee expired within a three year period were increased by \$10, from \$50 to \$60. The proposed statutory maximum for a new chair lease license or annual renewal of chair lease was decreased by \$10, from \$50 to \$40.

According to the fiscal note prepared by the Division of Budget, the Board of Barbering indicates it does not plan to increase fees in FY 2012 or FY 2013. Therefore, there would be no fiscal effect to the Board in either of these fiscal years.
