1	A RESOLUTION urging the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to accept
2	"Life of the Project" conservation easements.
3	WHEREAS, Conservation easements are needed to protect mitigation
4	areas resulting from construction of watershed district flood retarding
5	dams that require constant maintenance and management for an extended
6	period of time; and
7	WHEREAS, The life of the project is defined to include the period
8	of time during which the dam continues to function as a result of
9	maintenance or rehabilitation; and
10	WHEREAS, By definition, the life of the project would, for all
11	practical purposes, equate to perpetuity as described and desired by the
12	Corps; and
13	WHEREAS, It is not necessary for the easement language to state
14	perpetuity as the required term of the easement to effect the goals of the
15	Corps and the landowners; and
16	WHEREAS, Landowners are reluctant to sign perpetuity easements
17	for all time, without limits; and
18	WHEREAS, Whenever the impacted stream, woodland or wetland
19	is returned to its pre-dam condition as agreed to by the Corps, dam owner
20	and landowner, the easement is intended by all interested parties to be
21	terminated; and
22	WHEREAS, The intent to maintain the mitigation easement area the
23	same as is required of the project that created the need for the mitigation
24	area is understood by the dam owner, landowner and the Corps: Now,
25	therefore,
26	Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of
27	Kansas: That the members of the Kansas House of Representatives stand
28	in support of efforts to convince the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to
29	accept conservation easement language for the "Life of the Project" and
30	not for perpetuity; and
31	Be it further resolved: That the Chief Clerk of the House of
32	Representatives be directed to send enrolled copies of this resolution to
33	the Secretary of Defense, the Speaker of the United States House of
34	Representatives, the United States Senate Majority Leader, the United
35	States Senate Republican Leader, and each member of the Kansas
36	Congressional Delegation.
