1	A RESOLUTION urging the State Board of Education to encourage school
2	districts to administer the Kansas Communities That Care Survey.
3	WHEREAS, The Kansas Communities That Care youth survey, which
4	is implemented and funded by the Addiction and Prevention Services
5	division of the department of Social and Rehabilitation Services, tracks
6	teen usage of harmful substances such as alcohol, tobacco and illegal
7	drugs and provides information regarding teen participation in, perception
8	of, and attitudes toward prosocial and antisocial behavior at the peer,
9	school, family and community levels; and
10	WHEREAS, The survey provides measurable data concerning the risk
11	and protective factors that influence behavior, attitudes and opinions of
12	Kansas teens; and
13	WHEREAS, Such survey data is used to develop measurable outcomes
14	that communities throughout the state choose to target, and can be used to
15	track progress towards those outcomes; and
16	WHEREAS, The survey has been administered annually throughout the
17	state, free of charge, since 1994; and
18	WHEREAS, In 2011, 101,600 students from 247 school districts,
19	representing 70% of all eligible sixth, eighth, tenth and twelth grade
20	students all across Kansas, participated in the survey; and
21	WHEREAS, The survey data is an instrumental tool used by the
22	Juvenile Justice Authority and the Kansas Advisory Group to make
23	funding decisions and evaluate the effectiveness of youth programs: Now,
24	therefore,
25	<i>Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Kansas:</i>
26	That we urge the State Board of Education to continue the widespread use
27	of the Kansas Communities That Care survey to ensure that quality,
28	reliable data can be gathered and implemented to serve the youth of
29	Kansas; and
30	Be it further resolved: That the Chief Clerk of the House of
31	Representatives shall send an enrolled copy of this resolution to the
32	members of the State Board of Education.
