Senate Resolution No. 1806

A RESOLUTION urging the United States Congress to repeal 23 U.S.C. 1 2 § 127(d) concerning the federal freeze on more productive trucks and 3 allow Kansas to determine the appropriate vehicle size and weight 4 limits necessary for the economic needs of the state. 5 6 WHEREAS, The United States Congress approved 23 U.S.C. § 127(d) 7 on June 1, 1991, which froze the truck size and weight limits to those 8 weights and lengths that were being operated at such time; and 9 WHEREAS, Operation of more productive vehicles has been frozen by 10 federal law for 20 years; and WHEREAS, The custom harvesting industry requested that the 11 12 legislature approve additional length for their combination vehicles and 13 were informed of the federal freeze and the potential loss of federal 14 highway funds to Kansas should the freeze be violated; and 15 WHEREAS, States should have the flexibility to adopt vehicle size and 16 weight laws necessary for the economic growth for the state and region; 17 and 18 WHEREAS. The custom harvesting industry contributes to feeding this 19 country and to the United States' energy independence by efficiently and 20 effectively harvesting a variety of crops both for food and fuel; and 21 WHEREAS, The Western Governors' Association has approved a 22 policy resolution urging Congress to lift the freeze on more productive 23 trucks for the 13 western states: Kansas, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, 24 Nebraska, Nevada, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Dakota, 25 Utah, Washington and Wyoming; and 26 WHEREAS, Any change in vehicle size and weight laws must be 27 adopted by both the Kansas House of Representatives and Kansas Senate 28 and approved by the Governor: Now, therefore, 29 Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Kansas: That we urge the 30 United States Congress to repeal 23 U.S.C. § 127(d) and eliminate the 31 freeze on more productive trucks, thereby allowing Kansas to respond to 32 new technology and new vehicle size and weight requirements; and 33 Be it further resolved: That the Secretary of the Senate shall send an 34 enrolled copy of this resolution to the United States secretary of 35 transportation and each member of the Kansas congressional delegation.
