The Butler County Emergency Services Association is an association of emergency service agencies within Butler County that has united to find a solution to the communications problems and lack of inter-operability that has been plaguing our county for decades.

### During our short time as an association we have come to learn that some of the same problems we face are shared with agencies statewide. Simply put, communications and inter-operability for Kansas (state wide) is in crisis. It is that lack of basic communication (for both voice and data), coupled with a lack of inter-operability between agencies and disciplines, which puts our emergency responders and the citizens we are sworn to protect in danger.

After realizing the importance of the issue at hand, we decided as an association to begin our own grass roots efforts to help bring this issue to the forefront. We took it upon ourselves to address every statewide emergency service association we knew of to ask for their support to upgrade the statewide system to allow for seamless voice and data communications between all agencies. <u>ALL</u> of the associations are in agreement, as is reflected in the attached letters. Initially, we anticipated delivering the letters to only three individuals. As a result, some associations drafted letters specifically to the persons we originally intended to contact, so I apologize for the lack of recipient specific information.

Dear: Governor Sebelius

As president of the Kansas Emergency Management Assn. (KEMA), I pledge the support of KEMA in your efforts to ensure communications interoperability through the revision of the 800 Mhz radio system used by the State of Kansas. This project is long overdue and would greatly enhance the communications capability of state agencies during times of disaster.

We further recommend that the system be enhanced to include interoperability of local emergency responders. It's our understanding that the present capabilities are severely limited and do not allow space for local interfaces. Ideally the system should be used on a daily basis to both monitor the system for operational readiness and to allow a means for local responders to keep in touch with KHP personnel during daily emergencies

Our members are aware that the primary focus of the project is to ensure state agency use. Based on the various Homeland Security initiatives, we encourage broad thinking during the planning and design of the enhancements and recommend consideration for the integration of daily emergency responder interoperability.

To Whom It May Concern:

It has been brought to the attention of the Kansas Chapter of APCO Organization that your organization is seeking support to improve emergency communications to promote the establishment of statewide radio interoperability.

The Kansas Chapter of APCO, supports the concept of statewide communications. We do have reservations about the implementation of such an endeavor promoting the 800mhz system. The Kansas APCO Chapter is in complete agreement that there is a need for inter-operability. There is also concern over how such a project would be funded. It would be both prudent and beneficial for those looking at this issue to explore all options available. With thousands of emergency radios; emergency vehicle radios, hand held radios, pagers, mobile data terminals, main transmitters (base stations), control stations and console equipment , inter-operability will be a major project. With the majority of agencies requiring upgrades to accomplish this, it is imperative that an agency's budget be considered to make all upgrades possible.

It is the general consensus of our organization that even though the 800mhz system is installed throughout the state for limited range usage, the cost to join this system with local communications would be difficult if not impossible for some agencies to fund. We would encourage those addressing these issues to explore the many options of portable equipment; currently supported by the Homeland Security Plan for 2003 fiscal year that would meet this need in a more cost effective manner.

We concur that in these uncertain and security conscious times this project should become a priority issue for our state. As we are the communications center for local police, fire and law enforcement we appreciate the opportunity to voice our concerns on this issue. We would appreciate further involvement on this project and will do our best to serve in whatever capacity needed to see this important mission implemented in a cost effective and successful manner.
