## RE: House Committee on Federal and State Affairs House Bill No. 2052 Hearing

Since 2006 when the Personal and Family Protection act was passed firearm laws have changed for the better in Kansas. Since concealed carry passed we have law abiding citizens carrying and traveling from around the country and all over the state for business and personal reasons. We desperately need this bill passed for the uniformity I described above. The times have changed and times demand uniformity.

I urge this committee to vote yes on this bill and pass it to the full House for a vote.
