SUBJECT: Revised Fiscal Note for SB 69 by Senate Committee on Transportation

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following revised fiscal note concerning SB 69 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

Under SB 69, the date that a licensed vehicle dealer or manufacturer is required to provide proof that they have paid at least the first half of their personal property taxes when applying for vehicle registration would be moved from June 21 to May 10; the fee for a duplicate registration receipt would be increased from \$0.50 to \$1.00; and the weight limit on trucks which may apply for amateur radio operator license plates would be increased from 16,000 to 20,000 pounds. The bill would also delete outdated language which requires the completion of a form for the registration of antique vehicles for taxation purposes; and a list of fees already mentioned elsewhere in statute. Finally, the bill would delete the requirement that vehicle dealers purchase multiple sets of sixty-day temporary registration permits; and the requirement that dealers mail a copy of the completed permit to the Division of Motor Vehicles.

Originally, the Department of Revenue indicated that the passage of SB 69 would result in some additional programming costs, but has since determined that no programming costs would be necessary.
