1	AN ACT concerning-real estate brokers and salespersons; relating to-
2	license fees the Kansas expanded lottery act; amending K.S.A. 2012
3	Supp. 58-3063 2013 Supp. 74-8741, 74-8746 and 74-8747 and
4	repealing the existing section sections.
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6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
7	Section 1. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 58-3063 is hereby amended to read as
8	follows: 58-3063. (a) The commission shall adopt rules and regulations-
9	fixing the amounts of the fees provided for by this act, subject to the-
10	<u>following:</u>
11	(1) For any examination required for licensure, a fee in an amount
12	equal to the actual cost of the examination and the administration thereof.
13	(2) For any criminal history record check required for licensure, a fee
14	in the amount necessary to reimburse the commission for the cost of-
15	administering the criminal history record check.
16	(3) For submission of an application for an original salesperson's-
17	license, an amount not exceeding \$25.
18	(4) For submission of an application for an original broker's license;
19	an amount not exceeding \$50.
20	(5) For an original salesperson's license, a prorated fee based on a
21	two-year amount not exceeding \$100 \$150.
22	(6) For an original broker's license, a prorated fee based on a two-
23	year amount not exceeding \$150 \$200.
24	(7) For renewal of a salesperson's license, a fee based on a two-year
25	amount not exceeding \$100 \$150.
26	(8) For renewal of a broker's license, a fee based on a two-year-
27	amount not exceeding \$150 \$200.
28	(9) For reinstatement of a license which has been deactivated or-
29	which has been canceled pursuant to subsection (c) of K.S.A. 58-3047, and
30	amendments thereto, or by reason of termination of a salesperson, an-
31	amount not exceeding \$15.
32	(10) For reinstatement of all licenses canceled pursuant to subsections
33	(d) or (f) of K.S.A. 58-3047, and amendments thereto, an amount not
34	exceeding \$7.50 for each license canceled.
35	(11) For issuance of a duplicate license, an amount not exceeding
36	<del>\$10.</del>

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1	(12) For certification of licensure to another jurisdiction, an amount
2	not exceeding \$10.
3	(13) For approval of a course of instruction submitted by a course
4	provider pursuant to K.S.A. 58-3046a, and amendments thereto, an-
5	amount not exceeding \$75.
6	(14) For renewal of an approved course of instruction pursuant to
7	K.S.A. 58-3046a, and amendments thereto, an amount not exceeding \$15.
8	(15) For approval of a course of instruction submitted by any licensee
9	for credit toward the 12 hours of additional instruction required by K.S.A.
10	58-3046a, and amendments thereto, an amount not less than \$10 nor more
11	than \$20, as determined by the commission.
12	(16) For a temporary salesperson's license, an amount not exceeding
13	<u>\$25.</u>
14	(17) For each branch office opened or established after July 1, 2006,
15	an amount not exceeding \$100.
16	(18) For each primary office of a company created or established by a
17	supervising broker after July 1, 2006, an amount not exceeding \$100.
18	(19) For certification of a licensee's education history under K.S.A.
19	58-3046a, and amendments thereto, an amount not exceeding \$25.
20	(20) For certification of licensure of a professional corporation, an
21	amount not exceeding \$25.
22	(21) For each additional primary or branch office at which a
23	salesperson or an associate, supervising or branch broker is associated or
24	employed, if such person is associated or employed by more than one
25	primary or branch office, an amount not exceeding \$50, to be paid by such
26	salesperson or broker.
27	(b) For each prorated fee, the commission shall establish a monthly
28	amount, rounded off to the nearest dollar, and shall compute the fee from
29	the last calendar day of the month in which the license is issued to the
30	expiration date of the license.
31	(c) Subject to the limitations of this section, the commission shall fix
32	the fees provided for by this section in the amounts necessary to-
33	administer and enforce this act.
34	(d) The fees provided for by this section shall be applicable
35	regardless of the type of license.
36	New Section 1. The Kansas lottery commission shall negotiate an
37	addendum to existing lottery gaming facility management contracts that
38	prohibit the state from operating electronic gaming machines at
39	parimutuel licensee locations in the south central gaming zone until
40	after July 1, 2032.
41	Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8741 is hereby amended to read as
42	follows: 74-8741. (a) The executive director of the Kansas lottery shall
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43 negotiate a racetrack gaming facility management contract to place

1 electronic gaming machines at one parimutuel licensee location in each

2 gaming zone except the southwest Kansas gaming zone and the south
 3 central Kansas gaming zone.

4 (b) To be eligible to enter into a racetrack gaming facility 5 management contract the prospective racetrack gaming facility manager 6 shall, at a minimum:

7 (1) Have sufficient access to financial resources to support the 8 activities required of a racetrack gaming facility manager under the 9 Kansas expanded lottery act; and

10 (2) be current in filing all applicable tax returns and in payment of 11 all taxes, interest and penalties owed to the state of Kansas and any 12 taxing subdivision where such prospective manager is located in the 13 state of Kansas, excluding items under formal appeal pursuant to 14 applicable statutes.

15 16 (c) A racetrack gaming facility management contract shall include:
(1) The term of the contract;

(2) provisions for the Kansas racing and gaming commission to 17 18 oversee all racetrack gaming facility operations, including, but not 19 limited to: Oversight of internal controls; oversight of security of facilities; performance of background investigations, determination of 20 21 qualifications and any required certification or licensing of officers, 22 directors, board members, employees, contractors and agents of the 23 racetrack gaming facility manager; auditing of net electronic gaming machine income and maintenance of the integrity of electronic gaming 24 25 *machine operations;* 

(3) provisions for the racetrack gaming facility manager to pay the
 costs of oversight and regulation of the racetrack gaming facility
 manager under this act and such manager's racetrack gaming facility
 operations by the Kansas racing and gaming commission; and

(4) enforceable provisions: (A) Prohibiting the state, until July 1, 30 31 2032, from (i) entering into management contracts for more than three four lottery gaming facilities or similar gaming facilities, one to be 32 33 located in the northeast Kansas gaming zone, one to be located in the 34 south central Kansas gaming zone, one to be located in the southwest 35 Kansas gaming zone and one to be located in the southeast Kansas 36 gaming zone, (ii) designating additional areas of the state where operation of lottery gaming facilities or similar gaming facilities would 37 be authorized or (iii) operating an aggregate of more than 2,800 38 39 electronic gaming machines at all parimutuel licensee locations; and (B) requiring the state to repay to the racetrack gaming facility manager an 40 amount equal to the privilege fee paid by such racetrack gaming facility 41 manager, plus interest on such amount, compounded annually at the 42 43 rate of 10%, if the state violates the prohibition provision described in

1 (A).

2 (d) Racetrack gaming facility management contracts authorized by 3 this section may include provisions relating to:

4 (1) Accounting procedures to determine net electronic gaming 5 machine income, unclaimed prizes and credits;

6 (2) minimum requirements for a racetrack gaming facility manager 7 to provide qualified oversight, security and supervision of electronic 8 gaming machines including the use of qualified personnel with 9 experience in applicable technology;

10 (3) eligibility requirements for employees, contractors or agents of a 11 racetrack gaming facility manager who will have responsibility for or 12 involvement with electronic gaming machines or for the handling of 13 cash or tokens;

*(4)* background investigations to be performed by the Kansas racing
 and gaming commission;

(5) credentialing or certification requirements of any employee,
 contractor or agent as provided by the Kansas expanded lottery act or
 rules and regulations adopted pursuant thereto;

19 (6) provision for termination of the management contract by either 20 party for cause; and

(7) any other provision deemed necessary by the parties, including
 such other terms and restrictions as necessary to conduct racetrack
 gaming facility operations in a legal and fair manner.

(e) A person who is the manager of a lottery gaming facility in a
gaming zone shall not be eligible to be the manager of the racetrack
gaming facility in the same zone.

(f) A racetrack gaming facility management contract shall not
constitute property, nor shall it be subject to attachment, garnishment or
execution, nor shall it be alienable or transferable, except upon approval
by the executive director, nor shall it be subject to being encumbered or
hypothecated.

32 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8746 is hereby amended to read as 33 follows: 74-8746. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b):

(1) No electronic gaming machines shall be operated at a 34 parimutuel licensee location in Sedgwick county unless, during the first 35 full calendar year and each year thereafter in which electronic gaming-36 37 machines are operated at such location, the parimutuel licensee conducts at 38 such location at least 100 live greyhound races each calendar week for the 39 number of weeks raced during calendar year 2003 with at least 13 live races conducted each day for not less than five days per week the south 40 41 central Kansas gaming zone.

42 (2) (b) Except as provided in subsection (c): (1) No electronic 43 gaming machines shall be operated at a parimutuel licensee location in

1 Wyandotte county unless, during the first full calendar year and each year thereafter in which electronic gaming machines are operated at 2 such location, the parimutuel licensee conducts live horse racing 3 4 programs for at least 60 days, with at least 10 live races conducted each 5 program, and must offer and make a reasonable effort to conduct a 6 minimum number of three live races restricted for quarter horses each 7 day and seven live thoroughbred races each day, of which not less than two races each day shall be limited to registered Kansas-bred horses 8 apportioned in the same ratio that live races are offered, except that the 9 licensee shall not be required to conduct the second live race restricted 10 to Kansas-bred horses unless there are at least seven qualified entries 11 for such race, and with at least 100 live greyhound races each calendar 12 week for at least the same number of weeks raced during calendar year 13 2003, with at least 13 live races conducted each day for not less than five 14 15 days per week.

16 (3) (2) No electronic gaming machines shall be operated at a parimutuel licensee location in Crawford county unless, during the first 17 full calendar year and each year thereafter in which electronic gaming 18 19 machines are operated at such location, the parimutuel licensee 20 conducts at such location at least 85 live greyhound races each calendar week for the number of weeks raced during calendar year 2003 in 21 22 Sedgwick county, with at least 12 live races conducted each day for not 23 less than five days per week.

24 (4) (3) If a parimutuel licensee has not held live races pursuant to a 25 schedule approved by the Kansas racing and gaming commission in the preceding 12 months, the Kansas racing and gaming commission shall 26 hold a hearing to determine the number of days of live racing required 27 28 for the remaining days of the first calendar year of operation to qualify for operation of electronic gaming machines. At such hearing, the 29 commission shall receive testimony and evidence from affected breed 30 31 groups, the licensee and others, as the Kansas racing and gaming 32 commission deems appropriate concerning the schedule of live race 33 days. The operation of electronic gaming machines shall not commence more than 90 days prior to the start of live racing at such facility. 34

(b) (c) The Kansas racing and gaming commission may not grant 35 36 exceptions to the requirements of subsection-(a) (b) for a parimutuel 37 licensee conducting live racing unless such exception is in the form of 38 an agreement which: (1) Is between the parimutuel licensee and the 39 affected recognized greyhound or recognized horsemen's group, as defined in K.S.A. 74-8802, and amendments thereto; (2) has been 40 approved by the appropriate official breed registering agencies; and (3) 41 has been submitted to and approved by the commission. In the case of 42 43 emergencies, weather related issues or immediate circumstances beyond

the control of the licensee, the Kansas racing and gaming commission
 may grant an exception.

3 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8747 is hereby amended to read as 4 follows: 74-8747. (a) Net electronic gaming machine income from a 5 racetrack gaming facility shall be distributed as follows:

6 (1) To the racetrack gaming facility manager, an amount equal to 7 25% of net electronic gaming machine income;

8 (2) 7% of net electronic gaming machine income shall be credited to the live horse racing purse supplement fund established by K.S.A. 9 2013 Supp. 74-8767, and amendments thereto, except that the amount of 10 net electronic gaming machine income credited to the fund during any 11 fiscal year from electronic gaming machines at a racetrack gaming 12 facility shall not exceed an amount equal to the average of \$3,750 per 13 electronic gaming machine at each location and any moneys in excess of 14 such amount shall be distributed between the state and the racetrack 15 16 gaming facility manager in accordance with the racetrack gaming facility management contract; 17

(3) 7% of net electronic gaming machine income shall be credited 18 19 to the live greyhound racing purse supplement fund established by K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8767, and amendments thereto, except that the 20 21 amount of net electronic gaming machine income credited to the fund 22 during any fiscal year from electronic gaming machines at a racetrack gaming facility shall not exceed an amount equal to the average of 23 \$3,750 per electronic gaming machine at each location and any moneys 24 in excess of such amount shall be distributed between the state and the 25 racetrack gaming facility manager in accordance with the racetrack 26 gaming facility management contract; 27

28 (4) (A) if the racetrack gaming facility is located in the northeast 29 Kansas gaming zone and is not located within a city, include a provision for payment of an amount equal to 3% of the racetrack gaming facility 30 revenues net electronic gaming machine income to the county in which 31 32 the racetrack gaming facility is located; or (B) if the racetrack gaming facility is located in the northeast Kansas gaming zone and is located 33 within a city, include provision for payment of an amount equal to 1.5% 34 of the racetrack gaming facility revenues net electronic gaming machine 35 income to the city in which the racetrack gaming facility is located and 36 37 an amount equal to 1.5% of such revenues to the county in which such 38 *facility is located;* 

(5) (A) if the racetrack gaming facility is located in the southeast-or
south-central Kansas gaming zone and is not located within a city,
include a provision for payment of an amount equal to 2% of the
racetrack gaming facility revenues net electronic gaming machine income
to the county in which the racetrack gaming facility is located and an

1 amount equal to 1% of such revenues to the other county in such zone;

2 or (B) if the racetrack gaming facility is located in the southeast or south 3 central Kansas gaming zone and is located within a city, provide for 4 payment of an amount equal to 1% of the racetrack gaming facility-5 revenues net electronic gaming machine income to the city in which the 6 racetrack gaming facility is located, an amount equal to 1% of such 7 revenues to the county in which such facility is located and an amount 8 equal to 1% of such revenues to the other county in such zone;

9 (6) 2% of net electronic gaming machine income shall be credited 10 to the problem gambling and addictions grant fund established by K.S.A. 11 2013 Supp. 79-4805, and amendments thereto;

12 (7) 1% of net electronic gaming machine income shall be credited 13 to the Kansas horse fair racing benefit fund established by K.S.A. 74-14 8838, and amendments thereto;

(8) 40% of net electronic gaming machine income shall be credited
 to the expanded lottery act revenues fund; and

(9) 15% of electronic gaming machine income shall be used for
 gaming expenses, subject to agreement between the Kansas lottery and
 the racetrack gaming facility manager.

(b) A racetrack gaming facility management contract may include
provisions for a parimutuel licensee or any other entity to pay the
parimutuel licensee's expenses related to electronic gaming machines,
as the executive director deems appropriate, subject to the requirements
of subsection (a)(9).
