Senate Substitute for HOUSE BILL No. 2391

AN ACT concerning education; creating the joint committee on uniform
 educational standards oversight; amending K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 72-6439
 and 72-7535 and repealing the existing sections.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

6 New Section 1. (a) No school district, nor the department of 7 education nor the state board of education shall expend any moneys to 8 institute the common core standards, the next generation science standards 9 or any other uniform educational standards for grades kindergarten 10 through 12, or any portion of such standards, including any assessments 11 affiliated with such standards, that were not adopted by the state board of 12 education prior to the first day of the 2013 legislative session.

(b) Nothing in this section shall be construed in any manner so as to
 impinge upon any school district's authority to determine its own
 curriculum.

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(c) As used in this <u>subsection</u>, *{section:*

(1)} "Common core standards" means the set of uniform educational
 standards for grades kindergarten through 12 established by the common
 core state standards initiative_z {; and

20 (2) "uniform educational standards" means a set of educational 21 standards for grades kindergarten through 12 established by a 22 consortium of governmental entities, or by one or more other 23 organizations, that are uniformly adopted by two or more states.}

(d) The provisions of this section shall expire on April 15, 2014.

New Sec. 2. (a) There is hereby established the joint committee on uniform educational standards oversight. The joint committee shall review any uniform educational standards, including any assessments affiliated with such standards, that have either been adopted, or have been proposed for adoption by the state board of education.

30 (b) The joint committee shall consist of 11 members of the legislature31 appointed as follows:

32 (1) Two members of the house of representatives committee on33 education appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives;

34 (2) one member of the house of representatives committee on
35 education appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives;
36 (3) two members of the senate committee on education appointed by

1 the president of the senate;

2 (4) one member of the senate committee on education appointed by 3 the minority leader of the senate;

4 (5) one member of the house of representatives committee on 5 appropriations appointed by the chairperson of the house committee on 6 appropriations;

7 (6) one member of the senate committee on ways and means 8 appointed by the chairperson of the senate committee on ways and means;

9 (7) one member of the house of representatives committee on 10 appropriations appointed by the ranking minority member of the house committee on appropriations; 11

(8) one member of the senate committee on ways and means 12 appointed by the ranking minority member of the senate committee on 13 14 ways and means; and

15 (9) one member of the house of representatives appointed by the majority leader of the house of representatives. 16

17 (c) Members shall be appointed for terms coinciding with the 18 legislative terms for which such members are elected or appointed. All 19 members appointed to fill vacancies in the membership of the joint 20 committee and all members appointed to succeed members appointed to 21 membership on the joint committee shall be appointed in the manner 22 provided for the original appointment of the member succeeded. The first 23 meeting of the joint committee shall be held before August 1, 2013.

24 (d) The members originally appointed as members of the joint 25 committee shall meet upon the call of a member appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, who shall be appointed by the speaker of 26 27 the house of representatives as the chairperson. The vice-chairperson of 28 the joint committee shall be a member appointed by the president of the 29 senate, who shall be appointed by the president of the senate as the vice-30 chairperson. The ranking minority member shall be from the same 31 chamber as the chairperson.

32 (e) In accordance with K.S.A. 46-1204, and amendments thereto, the 33 legislative coordinating council may provide for such professional services 34 as may be requested by the joint committee.

35 (f) Members of the joint committee shall be paid compensation, travel 36 expenses and subsistence expenses or allowance as provided in K.S.A. 75-37 3212, and amendments thereto, for attendance at any meeting of the joint 38 committee or any subcommittee meeting authorized by the committee.

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(g) The joint committee shall:

40 (1) Review the common core standards, the next generation science standards or any other uniform educational standards for grades 41 42 kindergarten through 12, or any portion of such standards; 43

(2) review any assessments affiliated with such standards;

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1 (3) study the implementation of any such standards for school year 2 2013-2014; and

(4) determine whether such standards conform to Kansas educational
 values which provide for intellectual, educational, vocational and scientific
 improvement.

6 (h) The department of education shall provide data and information 7 for any of the uniform educational standards identified in subsection (g) to 8 the joint committee as requested.

9 (i) On or before January 10, 2014, and January 9, 2015, the joint 10 committee shall prepare and submit a written report to the legislature and 11 the governor on its findings and recommendations with respect to those 12 uniform educational standards identified in subsection (g). The report shall 13 include, but is not limited to:

14 (1) Recommendations as to the continued implementation of any
15 uniform educational standards adopted by the state board of education
16 prior to the first day of the 2013 legislative session;

17 (2) recommendations as to the adoption and implementation of any18 other uniform educational standards by the state board of education;

(3) recommendations for legislation to be considered by thelegislature during the 2014 legislative session; and

(4) an estimate of the fiscal effects of each of the joint committee'srecommendations.

(j) The joint committee may introduce such legislation as it deemsnecessary in performing its functions.

(k) The provisions of this section shall expire on June 30, 2015.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 72-6439 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-6439. (a) In order to accomplish the mission for Kansas education, the state board of education shall design and adopt a school performance accreditation system based upon improvement in performance that reflects high academic standards and is measurable.

(b) (1) The state board shall establish—eurriculum educational standards which reflect high academic standards for *Kansas education in* the core academic areas of mathematics, science, reading, writing and social studies. The-eurriculum educational standards shall be reviewed at least every seven years. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed in any manner so as to impinge upon any district's authority to determine its own curriculum.

38 (2) No educational standards established under subsection (b)(1) 39 shall include the common core standards, the next generation science 40 standards or any other uniform educational standards for grades 41 kindergarten through 12, or any portion of such standards, including any 42 assessments affiliated with such standards, that were not adopted by the 43 state board of education prior to the first day of the 2013 legislative 2 (3) As used in this subsection; {: (A)} "Common core standards"

10 (4) The provisions of subsections (b)(2) and (b)(3) shall expire on 11 April 15, 2014.

12 (c) The state board shall provide for statewide assessments in the core 13 academic areas of mathematics, science, reading, writing and social 14 studies. The board shall ensure compatibility between the statewide 15 assessments and the eurriculum educational standards established pursuant 16 to subsection (b). Such assessments shall be administered at three grade 17 levels, as determined by the board. The state board shall determine 18 performance levels on the statewide assessments, the achievement of 19 which represents high academic standards in the academic area at the 20 grade level to which the assessment applies. The state board should specify 21 high academic standards both for individual performance and school 22 performance on the assessments.

23 (d) Each school in every district shall establish a school site council 24 composed of the principal and representatives of teachers and other school 25 personnel, parents of pupils attending the school, the business community, 26 and other community groups. School site councils shall be responsible for 27 providing advice and counsel in evaluating state, school district, and 28 school site performance goals and objectives and in determining the 29 methods that should be employed at the school site to meet these goals and 30 objectives. Site councils may make recommendations and proposals to the 31 school board regarding budgetary items and school district matters, including but not limited to, identifying and implementing the best 32 33 practices for developing efficient and effective administrative and 34 management functions. Site councils also may help school boards analyze 35 the unique environment of schools, enhance the efficiency and maximize 36 limited resources, including outsourcing arrangements and cooperative 37 opportunities as a means to address limited budgets.

Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 72-7535 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-7535. (a) In order to equip students with the knowledge and skills needed to become self-supporting and to enable students to make critical decisions regarding personal finances, the state board of education shall authorize and assist in the implementation of programs on teaching personal financial literacy.

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1 (b) The state board of education shall develop a curriculum, materials 2 and guidelines that local boards of education and governing authorities of 3 accredited nonpublic schools may use in implementing the program of 4 instruction on personal financial literacy. The state board of education 5 shall adopt a glossary of personal financial literacy terms which shall be 6 used by school districts when implementing the program on personal 7 financial literacy.

8 (c) The state board of education shall develop state <u>curriculum</u> 9 *educational* standards for personal financial literacy, for all grade levels, 10 within the existing mathematics curriculum or another appropriate subject-11 matter curriculum.

(d) The state board of education shall encourage school districts when
 selecting textbooks for mathematics, economics, family and consumer
 science, accounting or other appropriate courses, to select those textbooks
 which contain substantive provisions on personal finance, including
 personal budgeting, credit, debt management and other topics concerning
 personal financial literacy.

18 (e) The state board of education shall include questions relating to 19 personal financial literacy in the statewide assessments for mathematics or social studies required under K.S.A. 72-6439, and amendments thereto. 20 21 When the statewide assessments for mathematics or social studies are 22 reviewed or rewritten, the state board of education shall examine the 23 questions relating to personal financial literacy and rewrite such questions 24 in order to determine if programs on personal financial literacy are 25 equipping students with the knowledge and skills needed to become selfsupporting and enabling students to make critical decisions regarding 26 27 personal finances.

28 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 72-6439 and 72-7535 are hereby repealed.
