1	A RESOLUTION encouraging the creation of a Kansas plan for
2	comprehensive treatment of chronic obstructive
3	pulmonary disease.
4	WHEREAS, Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) is a
5	chronic disease of the lung which cannot be cured; and
6	WHEREAS, At least 24 million Americans have COPD and data
7	suggest that as many as 12 million more Americans may have the
8	symptoms of COPD but are undiagnosed; and
9	WHEREAS, COPD was the third leading cause of death in the year
10	2000 and is projected to be the third leading cause of death in the year
11	2010 2012 ; and
12	WHEREAS, Costs attributed to COPD were projected to be \$49.9
13	billion in 2010; and
14	WHEREAS, Approximately 70% of individuals living with COPD are
15	under age 65; and
16	WHEREAS, COPD is the second leading cause of disability; and
17	WHEREAS, Up to 70% of the costs of COPD are due to
18	hospitalizations which can largely be prevented; and
19	WHEREAS, COPD is a leading cause of death in Kansas with as
20	many as 146.5 persons admitted to the hospital for every 100,000 persons
21 22	in Kansas; and WHEPEAS The main causes of COPD are smalling dust chemicals
22	WHEREAS, The main causes of COPD are smoking, dust, chemicals in the air and genetic disposition; and
23 24	WHEREAS, COPD is treatable and manageable; and
24 25	WHEREAS, COPD is treatable and manageable, and WHEREAS, It would behoove the state to develop and maintain a
23 26	COPD prevention and education state plan: Now, therefore,
27	<i>Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Kansas:</i>
28	That the Kansas department of health and environment is encouraged to
29	create a comprehensive COPD prevention and education state plan which
30	shall create and foster public awareness and increase knowledge
31	concerning the causes of COPD, the importance of early diagnosis,
32	effective prevention and disease management. Such plan shall outline
33	sustainable solutions for reducing the burden of COPD in Kansas through
34	the coordinated implementation of multiple strategies. These strategies
35	shall include, without limitation, recommendations for:
36	(1) The prevention and early detection of COPD to reduce the

1 incidence of the disease; and

(2) the treatment and management of COPD to ensure that health
care providers offer state-of-the-art care, including increased access to
nonpharmacologic therapies for COPD; and

5 (3) increasing public awareness, patient education and proper 6 medical management of COPD among the general public and those living 7 with COPD; and;

8 (4) improving COPD outcomes in Kansas through increases in
9 COPD funding and resources, as well as ongoing effective advocacy by
10 government leaders and people with COPD; and

11 *Be it further resolved:* That the Kansas department of health and 12 environment annually perform a COPD needs assessment; and

13 Be it further resolved: That the Kansas department of health and 14 environment hold an annual summit regarding COPD to be held in-15 partnership with the state COPD coalition; and

16 *Be it further resolved:* That the Chief Clerk of the House of 17 Representatives shall send an enrolled copy of this resolution to the 18 secretary of health and environment.
