AN ACT concerning the secretary of corrections; relating to victim 2 notification prior to release of certain inmates; amending K.S.A. 2013 3 Supp. 22-3727 and repealing the existing section.

5 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

6 Section 1. K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 22-3727 is hereby amended to read as 7 follows: 22-3727. (a) Prior to the release of any inmate on parole, 8 conditional release, expiration of sentence or postrelease supervision, if an 9 inmate is released into the community under a program under the supervision of the secretary of corrections, or after the escape of an inmate 10 or death of an inmate while in the secretary of corrections' custody, the 11 12 secretary of corrections shall give written notice of such release, escape or 13 death to any victim of the inmate's crime who is alive and whose address is 14 known to the secretary or, if the victim is deceased, to the victim's family 15 if the family's address is known to the secretary. Such notice shall be 16 required to be given to the victim or the victim's family only if the inmate 17 was convicted of any crime in article 33, 34, 35 or 36 of chapter 21 of the 18 Kansas Statutes Annotated, prior to their repeal, or articles 53, 54, 55 or 56 19 of chapter 21 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, or K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 21-20 6104, 21-6325, 21-6326 or 21-6418 through 21-6421, and amendments 21 thereto. Whenever feasible, such notice shall be given at least 14 working 22 days prior to the release of such inmate. Failure to notify the victim or the 23 victim's family as provided in this section shall not be a reason for 24 postponement of parole, conditional release or other forms of release.

25 (b) As used in this section, "victim's family" means a spouse, 26 surviving spouse, children, parents, legal guardian, siblings, stepparent or 27 grandparents.
