Senate Resolution No. 1711

A RESOLUTION opposing the black-footed ferret programmatic safe 1 2 harbor agreement and environmental assessment. 3 4 WHEREAS, The United States fish and wildlife service reintroduced 5 black-footed ferrets into Logan county, Kansas as part of a recovery effort 6 in December 2007; and WHEREAS, The reintroduction has been expensive, unsuccessful and 7 8 wrought with problems ranging from destructive prairie dog infestations to monetary losses for Kansas landowners; and 9 10 WHEREAS, The U.S. fish and wildlife service has drafted a blackfooted ferret programmatic safe harbor agreement and an environmental 11 12 assessment to encourage non-federal landowners to voluntarily allow 13 reintroduction of black-footed ferrets on their properties; and 14 WHEREAS, The safe harbor agreement and environmental 15 assessment is insufficient and misleading. It was developed rashly and 16 without adequate information; and 17 WHEREAS, No environmental impact statement was conducted despite the fact that it is required when major federal action significantly 18 19 impacts the human environment; and 20 WHEREAS, The U.S. fish and wildlife service did not coordinate with 21 county or local governments in the development of the safe harbor 22 agreement; and 23 WHEREAS, The safe harbor agreement included no reference or 24 discussion of conflicts with local government plans, even though Logan 25 county has a plan opposing the ferret introduction; and WHEREAS, The safe harbor agreement failed to mention the impact 26 to non-enrolled, adjacent landowners in the present and the future, despite 27 the fact that there is evidence that the introduction of black-footed ferrets 28 in Logan county has detrimentally affected neighboring landowners; and 29 30 WHEREAS, There has been a complete disregard for the risk to the health and safety of Kansans because of plague outbreaks. The plague is 31 32 now present in all 12 states where black-footed ferrets have been 33 introduced: Now, therefore, 34 Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Kansas: That we have an obligation and responsibility to represent the interests of the people of 35 36 this state and promote economic stability, encourage a sound environment 1 and protect the health, safety and welfare of our citizens.

Be it further resolved: That we oppose the black-footed ferret programmatic safe harbor agreement and environmental assessment, request that the U.S. fish and wildlife service exclude Kansas from the territory contained in the safe harbor agreement and request that the U.S. fish and wildlife service refrain from further releases of black-footed ferrets in Kansas.

8 *Be it further resolved:* That should the U.S. fish and wildlife service 9 move forward with the safe harbor agreement in Kansas against the 10 wishes of the Senate of the State of Kansas, we strongly encourage the 11 U.S. fish and wildlife service to use a formal rule-making process to 12 stipulate protection of all private landowners in areas where releases of 13 the black-footed ferret might occur, rather than utilize the informal safe 14 harbor agreement.

15 *Be it further resolved:* That should the U.S. fish and wildlife service 16 move forward with the safe harbor agreement in Kansas against the 17 wishes of the Senate of the State of Kansas, we strongly encourage the 18 U.S. fish and wildlife service to conduct an environmental impact 19 statement before moving forward.

Be it further resolved: That the Secretary of the Senate shall send an
enrolled copy of this resolution to the administrator of the U.S. fish and
wildlife service; the governors, state legislatures and congressional
delegations of Arizona, Colorado, Montana, New Mexico, South Dakota,
Utah and Wyoming; the Kansas congressional delegation; the U.S.
secretary of agriculture; and the Kansas secretary of agriculture.
