Approval of Committee minutes.

<u>The minutes for the March 17, 2015, meeting were unanimously approved.</u> (Motion by Representative Kelly and seconded by Representative Campbell)

<u>Consideration and possible action on: HB2134 — Authorizing consumer credit report security</u> <u>freezes for individuals less than 18 years old.</u>

The Chairman opened discussion on <u>HB2134</u>. Background information on the bill was provided for members (<u>Attachment 1</u>).

<u>A motion was made by Representative Kelly and seconded by Representative Campbell to recommend</u> the bill as favorable for passage.

<u>Representative Ousley moved, seconded by Representative Burroughs, to clarify some provisions of the</u> <u>bill with a balloon amendment (Attachment 2).</u>

<u>Representative Goico offered a substitute motion to the balloon amendment, adding to the balloon that</u> the bill's provisions be implemented on January 1, 2016. Seconded by Representative Ousley, the <u>motion passed unanimously.</u>

<u>Representative Ousley moved, seconded by Representative Bradford, to recommend HB2134 as</u> <u>amended to be favorable for passage. The motion passed unanimously.</u>

The Chair invited action on <u>SB240</u>. <u>Representative Kelly made a motion, seconded by Representative</u> Campbell, to recommend <u>SB240</u> as favorable for passage.

<u>Representative Kelly moved to amend the bill with a balloon stipulating that any fees adopted during</u> the past year by the Office of the State Bank Commissioner be reported to the legislature (Attachment 3).

<u>A substitute motion was made by Representative Burroughs and seconded by Representative Kelly to</u> <u>adopt the balloon amendment and to include wording that removed the words "general government</u> <u>budget committee" and substitute the words "appropriate budget sub-committee." The substitute</u> <u>motion passed.</u>

<u>Representative Kelly made a motion, seconded by Representative Billinger, to amend the bill further by</u> <u>adding a reporting requirement that any new special orders adopted by the Office of the State Bank</u> <u>Commissioner be reported to the legislature (Attachment 4).</u>

The Chair received approval from members in the audience who were the original proponents of the bill.

<u>A motion was made by Representative DeGraaf and seconded by Representative Campbell to give staff</u> <u>latitude in providing technical language to clarify the intent of the bill. The motion passed</u> <u>unanimously</u>.

<u>Representative Kelly moved, seconded by Representative Billinger, that **SB240** as amended be considered favorable for passage. The motion passed unanimously.</u>

The Chair thanked members and staff of the Committee for their service and adjourned the meeting at 3:59 p.m. No further meeting was scheduled.

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
