House Bill No. 2055 - State Board of Pharmacy Amendments

Section 1. 65-1626. This section is the definition section for the pharmacy act (there are a lot of them!). This bill modifies a number of the definitions, adds new definitions and replaces/deletes a couple of definitions.

Sec. 2. 65-1627. Sets out grounds for discipline against a pharmacist; sub (d) concerns disciplinary action against retail dealers; sub (e) relates to disciplinary action against pharmacies; sub (f) relates to manufacturing or repackaging drugs, wholesale distributors, sellers of durable medical equipment and operators of third-party logistics providers.

Sec. 3. 65-1633. Pharmacists required to report residential address and e-mail address changes.

Sec. 4. 65-1635. Sets out a list of activities not prohibited by the pharmacy act.

Sec. 5. 65-1636. The sale and dispensing of drugs are limited to pharmacies.

Sec. 6. 65-1637. A detailed section on how a pharmacist receives, fills and refills prescription orders.

New Sec. 7. Automated dispensing systems required to be under the supervision of a pharmacist.

Sec. 8. 65-1642. Required pharmacy equipment, files and medical profile record system.

Sec. 9. 65-1643. Sets out unlawful acts.

Sec. 10. 65-1645. Applications for registrations and permits; established fees.

Sec. 11. 65-1648. Requirements relating to drug keeping by entities such as medical care facilities, adult care homes and health departments.

Sec. 12. 65-1655. Wholesale distributors registration requirements.

New Sec. 13. Third-party logistics provider application requirements.

New Sec. 14. Outsourcing facility application requirements.

Sec. 15. 65-1663. Pharmacy technician requirements.

Sec. 16. 65-1676. Pharmacy intern requirements.

New Sec. 17. Board authorized to adopt rules and regulations on proper compounding practices and distribution.

Sec. 18. 65-669. This section commences the "trailer" section of the bill making changes in
