Thank you for your consideration of HB 2381 to address the needs of the Land Institute to continue their efforts to lead research and development of crops and conservation.

Touring their current facilities, you will see industry leading work to develop perennial crops to feed the world. The benefits of perennial crops are many. Farmers would not have to plant each year, and it would eliminate the need for tillage work. Having an established stand of plants would greatly reduce issues of erosion from both wind or rainfall at all times of the year. The list of benefits is long.

The Land Institute has several efforts underway to improve sustainability and conservation in agriculture. However, the results of plant breeding and development are not easy or immediate. It does require great expertise and investment, just as research does at our agricultural universities.
