

Senate Committee on Assessment and Taxation Hearing on SB 224 Hearing Date- March 17, 2017

Written Testimony in SUPPORT of SB 224 on behalf of the City of Manhattan By Kiel Mangus, Assistant City Manager

Good morning Chair Tyson, Vice Chair Kerschen and honorable members of the Senate Assessment and Taxation Committee. My name is Kiel Mangus, and I am the Assistant City Manager for the City of Manhattan.

The City of Manhattan <u>SUPPORTS</u> SB 224 providing for a \$.05 increase in motor fuel taxes. The City of Manhattan is continually growing, and the region is a significant economic engine for the State of Kansas. Decreased funding to Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) and the reduction in Special City/County Highway Fund (SCCHF) distributions has restricted our ability to accommodate growth and economic development.

- The City of Manhattan supports the fully funded T-WORKS program and encourages the legislature to avoid redirecting designated and traditional transportation funding for other state priorities.
- The legislature should be cautious about operating reductions that are occurring to the Kansas Department of Transportation, which may negatively impact routine pavement and sign maintenance and snow/ice operations.
- The City of Manhattan supports the increased funding being properly distributed to cities and counties in order to get important transportation safety projects done, including: safety transportation projects and projects that address congestion issues in growing communities.
- The City of Manhattan supports the implementation of an effective multi-modal transportation program aligned with the region's priorities; supports measures to encourage regional approaches to public transit and transportation planning, and supports the practice of long-term multi-year comprehensive transportation programs developed through a combination of KDOT technical analysis together with local government and other stakeholder involvement.
- SB 224 would help raise the necessary revenues to address the state's remaining transportation needs and protect existing T-WORKS funds for transportation purposes.
