SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2093 by House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2093 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

Under HB 2093, a juvenile adjudication would not be considered and scored as criminal history in an adult sentence if:

1. The current crime of conviction is committed at least five years after the date of final discharge of the adjudication;
2. The offender has no new adjudications or convictions during that five-year period; and
3. The juvenile adjudication is for an offense that would be a nondrug severity level five through ten felony, drug felony, nongrid felony or misdemeanor, if committed by an adult.

The Kansas Sentencing Commission indicates HB 2093 could have an impact on prison admission and bed space, but any fiscal effect that may result cannot be determined at this time. The Office of Judicial Administration indicates that any fiscal effect on the Judicial Branch that may result from the enactment of this bill could be absorbed within existing resources.
