SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2198 by House Committee on Judiciary

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2198 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2198 would amend the list of crimes for which an offender is required to submit biological samples to the Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI). The bill would add the crimes of domestic battery and stalking.

According to the KBI, enactment of HB 2198 would increase the number of biological samples received by approximately 6,720 samples per year, which would increase fee fund revenues by approximately \$346,137 in both FY 2018 and FY 2019. The agency states there would also be a slight increase in supplies purchased. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2198 is not reflected in *The FY 2018 Governor's Budget Report*.
