SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2344 by House Committee on K-12 Education Budget

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2344 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2344 would amend current law regarding school finance. The bill would establish a budget for a school district with three components: (1) State-Level Foundation Obligation; (2) Local Foundation Budget; and, (3) Local Option Budget (LOB).

### **State-Level Foundation Obligation**

The State-Level Foundation Obligation for a district would be calculated by taking \$4,000 times the adjusted enrollment of a district (as determined by KSA 72-6407, prior to its repeal). This portion of the budget would be financed from a 20-mill levy on property located within a district along with a state aid component. The bill would authorize the 20-mill levy for the 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 school years.

### **Local Foundation Budget**

The Local Foundation Budget of a school district would be calculated by taking \$1,000 times the adjusted enrollment of a district (as determined by KSA 72-6407, prior to its repeal). This portion of the budget would be financed entirely from property taxes levied at an amount required to fully fund the Local Foundation Budget.

# **Local Option Budget**

A school district would have the option of establishing a Local Option Budget (LOB), which could be authorized up to 5.0 percent of a district's "foundation funding," which is defined as the sum of a district's State-level Foundation Budget and the Local Foundation Budget. Any LOB resolution that would be adopted by local board of education in excess of 4.0 percent of a district's "foundation funding" would have to be approved by a majority of the qualified electors of a school district.

According to the Kansas Department of Education, enactment of HB 2344 would reduce state aid to school districts by approximately \$280.0 million, all from the State General Fund. Of this amount, the Department indicates the State-Level Foundation Budget would require an additional \$100.0 million in state aid payments to districts, while the Local Option Budget would decrease state aid payments by \$380.0 million, for a net reduction of \$280.0 million. This estimated reduction would be in comparison to funding currently included in the school district block grant funding mechanism. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2344 is not reflected in *The FY 2018 Governor's Budget Report*.
