SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 108 by Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 108 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

Under SB 108, public employers would not be liable for any wrongful or negligent act of an employee carrying a concealed handgun.

The Office of the Attorney General states that the bill would not have a fiscal effect on agency operations. The Office notes that state agencies and municipalities are currently immune from liability for acts or omissions regarding handguns that are carried in a state or municipal building. SB 108 would extend the protection from liability for public employers even if the public employee is not in a state or municipal building. While the Office has not been asked to defend any state agency from lawsuits resulting from wrongful or negligent acts of employees carrying concealed handguns, the bill would provide a mechanism to quickly dismiss cases that may be brought in the future.

Local governments could also avoid potential litigation costs arising from wrongful or negligent acts of carrying concealed handguns by public employees with the enactment of SB 108. However, neither the Kansas Association of Counties nor the League of Kansas Municipalities is able to estimate the fiscal effect, as the number of acts that would be mitigated is unknown. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 108 is not reflected in *The FY 2018 Governor's Budget Report*.
