HOUSE BILL No. 2446

By Joint Committee on Kansas Security

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AN ACT concerning the joint committee on Kansas security; relating to
 membership thereon; amending K.S.A. 46-2101 and K.S.A. 2017
 Supp. 46-3301 and repealing the existing section sections.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 46-2101 is hereby amended to read as follows: 6 7 46-2101. (a) There is hereby established the joint committee on 8 information technology which shall be within the legislative branch of state government and which shall be composed of five members of the 9 senate and five members of the house of representatives. Two of the 10 11 senate members shall be appointed by the president of the senate, two 12 of the senate members shall be appointed by the minority leader of the 13 senate and one of the senate members shall be appointed by the chairperson of the committee on ways and means of the senate. Two of 14 the representative members shall be appointed by the speaker of the 15 16 house of representatives, two of the representative members shall be appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives and 17 18 one of the representative members shall be appointed by the 19 chairperson of the committee on appropriations of the house of 20 representatives. The members of the joint committee on information 21 technology and the chairperson and vice-chairperson serving in such 22 capacities on the effective date of this act shall continue serving as 23 members and in such capacities, respectively, subject to the other 24 provisions of this section.

(b) All members of the joint committee on information 25 26 technology shall serve for terms ending on the first day of the regular 27 legislative session in odd-numbered years. The joint committee shall 28 organize annually and elect a chairperson-and, vice-chairperson and 29 ranking minority member in accordance with this subsection. On and 30 after the first day of the regular legislative session in odd-numbered 31 vears, the chairperson shall be one of the representative members of the joint committee elected by the members of the joint committee and 32 the vice-chairperson shall be one of the senate members elected by the 33 members of the joint committee and, after the first day of the regular 34 legislative session in even-numbered years, the chairperson shall be 35 one of the senate members of the joint committee elected by the 36

1 members of the joint committee and the vice-chairperson shall be one

2 of the representative members of the joint committee elected by the 3 **members of the joint committee.** The ranking minority member shall be 4 one of the members of the joint committee elected by the members of the 5 joint committee. The ranking minority member shall be from the same chamber as the chairperson. The chairperson-and, vice-chairperson and 6 7 ranking minority member of the joint committee shall serve in such capacities until the first day of the regular legislative session in the 8 9 ensuing year. The vice-chairperson shall exercise all of the powers of 10 the chairperson in the absence of the chairperson. If a vacancy occurs in the office of chairperson or vice-chairperson, a member of the joint 11 12 committee, who is a member of the same house as the member who 13 vacated the office, shall be elected by the members of the joint 14 committee to fill such vacancy.

(c) A quorum of the joint committee on information technology
shall be six. All actions of the joint committee shall be taken by a
majority of all of the members of the joint committee.

18 (d) The joint committee on information technology may meet at 19 any time and at any place within the state on the call of the 20 chairperson.

(e) The provisions of the acts contained in article 12 of chapter 46
 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto,
 applicable to special committees shall apply to the joint committee on
 information technology to the extent that the same do not conflict with
 the specific provisions of this act applicable to the joint committee.

(f) In accordance with K.S.A. 46-1204 and amendments thereto,
 the legislative coordinating council may provide for such professional
 services as may be requested by the joint committee on information
 technology.

30 (g) The joint committee on information technology may introduce
 31 such legislation as it deems necessary in performing its functions.

(h) (1) On the effective date of this act the joint committee on
computers and telecommunications shall be and is hereby officially
designated as the joint committee on information technology.

35 (2) On and after the effective date of this act, whenever the joint 36 committee on computers and telecommunications, or words of like 37 effect, is referred to or designated by a statute, contract or other 38 document, created before the effective date of this act, the reference or 39 designation shall mean and apply to the joint committee on 40 information technology.

41 (3) Nothing in this act shall be construed as abolishing or 42 reestablishing the joint committee on computers and 43 telecommunications.

Section 1. Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 46-3301 is hereby amended to 1 2 read as follows: 46-3301. (a) There is hereby established a joint committee 3 on Kansas security which shall consist of five members of the house of 4 representatives and five members of the senate. Three of the members who 5 are representatives shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of 6 representatives, three members who are senators shall be appointed by the 7 president of the senate, two members who are representatives shall be 8 appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives and two 9 members who are senators shall be appointed by the minority leader of the 10 senate. The speaker of the house of representatives shall designate a representative member to be chairperson or vice-chairperson of the 11 12 committee as provided by this section. The president of the senate shall 13 designate a senator member to be chairperson or vice-chairperson of the 14 joint committee as provided by this section. Either the minority leader of 15 the house of representatives shall designate a representative member or 16 the minority leader of the senate shall designate a senator member to be 17 ranking minority member of the committee as provided by this section.

(b) The Kansas bureau of investigation shall conduct a criminal
 history record check and background investigation of all committee staff
 members of the legislative research department and the office of the
 revisor of statutes.

22 (c) A quorum of the joint committee on Kansas security shall be six. 23 All actions of the committee may be taken by a majority of those present 24 when there is a quorum. In odd-numbered years the chairperson and 25 ranking minority member of the joint committee shall be the designated 26 member of the house of representatives from the convening of the regular 27 session in that year until the convening of the regular session in the next 28 ensuing year. In even-numbered years the chairperson and ranking 29 minority member of the joint committee shall be the designated member of 30 the senate from the convening of the regular session of that year until the 31 convening of the regular session of the next ensuing year. The vice-32 chairperson shall exercise all of the powers of the chairperson in the 33 absence of the chairperson.

(d) The joint committee on Kansas security may meet at any time and
at any place within the state on call of the chairperson. Members of the
joint committee shall receive compensation and travel expenses and
subsistence expenses or allowances as provided in K.S.A. 75-3212, and
amendments thereto, when attending meetings of such committee
authorized by the legislative coordinating council.

40 (e) Amounts paid under authority of this section shall be paid from
41 appropriations for legislative expense and vouchers therefor shall be
42 prepared by the director of legislative administrative services and
43 approved by the chairperson or vice-chairperson of the legislative

1 coordinating council.

2 (f) The joint committee on Kansas security may introduce such 3 legislation as deemed necessary in performing such committee's functions.

4 (g) The joint committee on Kansas security shall have the services of 5 the legislative research department, the office of the revisor of statutes and 6 other central legislative staff service agencies.

7 (h) The joint committee on Kansas security shall study, monitor,8 review and make recommendations for the following:

(1) Matters relating to the security of state officers or employees;

10 (2) security of buildings and property under the ownership or control11 of the state of Kansas;

12 (3) matters relating to the security of a public body or agency, public13 building or facility;

(4) matters relating to the security of the infrastructure of Kansas,including any information system; and

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(5) measures for the improvement of security for the state of Kansas.

(i) The joint committee on Kansas security shall review and monitor
federal moneys received by the state for the purposes of homeland security
and other related security matters.

20 (j) The joint committee on Kansas security shall report to the 21 legislature on or before December 31 each year any findings and 22 recommendations concerning Kansas security which the joint committee 23 deems appropriate.
