AN ACT concerning the department of corrections; relating to the Lansing correctional facility.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) On the effective date of this act, the provisions of section 214(e) of chapter 104 of the 2017 Session Laws of Kansas are hereby declared to be null and void and shall have no force and effect.

- (b) On the effective date of this act, notwithstanding the provisions of any statute, the department of corrections shall not expend any moneys appropriated from the state general fund or from any special revenue fund or funds for fiscal year 2018 or fiscal year 2019 as authorized by chapter 104 of the 2017 Session Laws of Kansas or any appropriation act of the 2018 regular session of the legislature, to enter into a lease purchase agreement or issue bonds to design, construct and equip a correctional institution in Lansing, Kansas, or to demolish the existing correctional institution in Lansing, Kansas, without prior specific authorization by an act of the legislature or an appropriation act of the legislature.
- (c) During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018, and the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019, in addition to the other purposes for which expenditures may be made from the state general fund or any special revenue fund or funds for fiscal year 2018 or fiscal year 2019 by the department of corrections by chapter 104 of 2017 Session Laws of Kansas or any appropriation act of the 2018 regular session of the legislature, expenditures shall be made by the department of corrections from the state general fund or any special revenue fund or funds to issue a subsequent request for proposal for the design, construction and equipment of a correctional institution in Kansas. Prior to issuing such request for proposal, the department of corrections shall seek input from mental health providers, the Kansas sentencing commission, local communities interested in a correctional facility and any other stakeholders deemed necessary by the department of corrections. Further, the department of corrections shall first advise and consult on any such project with the joint committee on state building construction prior to issuing the request for proposal. The Kansas development finance authority shall assist the department of corrections on the potential financing options for such proposed correctional institution as requested by the department.
