A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging Congress to take action to 1 2 regulate interstate commerce and allow states to collect sales tax directly from remote retailers. 3 4 5 WHEREAS, Small businesses have been hurt in recent years by online and catalog purchases by customers who believe they get a discount by 6 not paying sales tax; and 7 WHEREAS, The brick-and-mortar retailers collect the sales tax at the 8 9 time of purchase in a store, but the responsibility for paying the tax from 10 an online purchase shifts to the internet customer who should pay the sales tax when filing annual state tax returns; and 11 12 WHEREAS, The present system is ineffective and has serious enforcement problems. State tax administrators have no way of assessing 13 or collecting use taxes on many internet purchases. As a result, the 14 15 integrity of the states' tax bases are being undermined, and severe damage 16 is being done to the perceived equity of the tax system; and WHEREAS, The Supreme Court's decision in Quill Corp. v. North 17 Dakota, 504 U.S. 298 (1992), left state and local governments unable to 18 19 adequately enforce their existing sales tax laws on sales by out-of-state 20 catalog and online sellers; and 21 WHEREAS, The inability to collect sales and use taxes due on remote 22 sales threatens the future viability of the sales tax as a stable revenue 23 source for state and local governments; and 24 WHEREAS, Keeping track of local tax rates is no longer an 25 insurmountable technical, administrative, or financial burden; and WHEREAS, In the Quill decision, the Supreme Court did state that 26 27 Congress had the constitutional authority to pass legislation overruling its 28 decision; and 29 WHEREAS, If Congress acts to regulate interstate commerce, state and local governments could collect taxes owed on internet and mail 30 31 order sales: Now, therefore, 32 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Kansas, the Senate concurring therein: That the Kansas Legislature does hereby 33 urge the United States Congress to take action to regulate interstate 34 commerce by allowing individual states the authority to collect sales tax 35

36 directly from remote retailers; and

Be it further resolved: That the Secretary of State shall send an enrolled copy of this resolution to each member of the Kansas congressional delegation and to the President of the United States.
