11	<i>Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:</i>
12	Section 1.
13	DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION
14	(a) There is appropriated for the above agency from the state general
15	fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019, the following:
16	General state aid transportation weighting\$96,600,000
17	Special education transportation weighting\$10,000,000
18	Career and technical education transportation\$2,600,000
19	State foundation aid (652-00-1000-0840)\$96,600,000
20	Special education services aid (652-00-1000-0700)\$10,000,000
21	Career and technical education transportation\$650,000
22	(b) The director of accounts and reports shall not make the transfer of
23	\$24,150,000 from the state highway fund of the department of
24	transportation to the general state aid transportation weighting - state
25	highway fund (652-00-2222-2222) of the department of education that was
26	authorized to be made on July 1, 2018, October 1, 2018, January 1, 2019,
27	and April 1, 2019, by section 2(b) of chapter 95 of the 2017 Session Laws
28	of Kansas and, on July 1, 2018, the provisions of section 2(b) of chapter 95
29	of the 2017 Session Laws of Kansas that provide for such transfers are
30	hereby declared to be null and void and shall have no force and effect.
31	(c) The director of accounts and reports shall not make the transfer of
32	\$2,500,000 from the state highway fund of the department of
33	transportation to the special education transportation weighting – state
34	highway fund (652-00-2223-2223) of the department of education that was
35	authorized to be made on July 1, 2018, October 1, 2018, January 1, 2019,

4 (d) The director of accounts and reports shall not make the transfer of 5 \$650,000 from the state highway fund of the department of transportation 6 to the career and technical education transportation – state highway fund 7 (652-00-2139-2139) of the department of education that was authorized to 8 be made on July 1, 2018, October 1, 2018, January 1, 2019, and April 1, 9 2019, by section 2(b) of chapter 95 of the 2017 Session Laws of Kansas 10 and, on July 1, 2018, the provisions of section 2(b) of chapter 95 of the 2017 Session Laws of Kansas that provide for such transfers are hereby 11 12 declared to be null and void and shall have no force and effect.

13 (e) On July 1, 2018, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer 14 all moneys in the general state aid transportation weighting - state 15 highway fund, special education transportation weighting – state highway 16 fund and career and technical education transportation - state highway 17 fund of the department of education to the state highway fund of the 18 department of transportation. On July 1, 2018, all liabilities of the general 19 state aid transportation weighting – state highway fund, special education 20 transportation weighting - state highway fund and career and technical 21 education transportation - state highway fund of the department of 22 education are hereby transferred to and imposed on the state highway fund 23 of the department of transportation and the general state aid transportation 24 weighting – state highway fund, special education transportation weighting 25 - state highway fund and career and technical education transportation -26 state highway fund of the department of education are hereby abolished.

Sec. 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the transportation weightings of school districts computed under the Kansas school equity and enhancement act, K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5131 et seq., and amendments thereto, shall be funded from the state general fund. No appropriations or transfers shall be made during any fiscal year from the state highway fund to the department of education to pay for such transportation weightings.

11	(5) divide the amount determined under subsection $(a)(2)$ by the-
12	product obtained under subsection (a)(4);
13	(6) add one to the quotient obtained under subsection (a)(5);
14	(7) multiply the sum obtained under subsection (a)(6) by the amount
15	determined under subsection (a)(3);
16	(8) divide the amount determined under subsection $(a)(1)$ by the-
17	product obtained under subsection (a)(7). The resulting quotient is the per-
18	student cost of transportation;
19	(9) on a density-cost graph, plot the per-student cost of transportation
20	for each school district;
21	(10) construct a curve of best fit for the points so plotted;
22	(11) locate the index of density for the school district on the base line
23	of the density-cost graph and from the point on the curve of best fit-
24	directly above this point of index of density follow a line parallel to the
25	base line to the point of intersection with the vertical line, which point is
26	the formula per-student cost of transportation of the school district;
27	(12) divide the formula per-student cost of transportation of the
28	school district by the BASE aid; and
29	(13) multiply the quotient obtained under subsection (a)(12) by the
30	number of students who are included in the enrollment of the school-
31	district, are residing 2 ⁺ / ₂ miles or more by the usually traveled road to the
32	school building they attend, and for whom transportation is being made
33	available by, and at the expense of, the district.
34	(b) (1) For school years 2017-2018 through 2020-2021, the-
35	transportation weighting of the school district shall be either the product
36	determined under subsection (a)(13), or that portion of such school-
37	district's general state aid for school year 2016-2017 that was attributable
38	to the school district's transportation weighting, whichever is greater.
39	(2) For school year 2021-2022, and each school year thereafter, the
40	transportation weighting of the school district shall be the product-
41	determined under subsection (a)(13).

(b) (1) For school years 2018-2019 through 2020-2021, the
transportation weighting of the school district shall be either the quotient
determined under subsection (a)(1)(E), or that portion of such school
district's general state aid for school year 2016-2017 that was attributable
to the school district's transportation weighting, whichever is greater.

26 (2) For school year 2021-2022, and each school year thereafter, the 27 transportation weighting of the school district shall be the quotient 28 determined under subsection (a)(1)(E).

(c) For the purpose of providing accurate and reliable data on
 student transportation, the state board is authorized to adopt rules and
 regulations prescribing procedures that school districts shall follow in
 reporting pertinent information, including uniform reporting of
 expenditures for transportation.

(d) As used in this section:

35 (1) "Curve of best fit" means the curve on a density-cost graph drawn
 36 so the sum of the distances squared from such line to each of the points.
 37 plotted on the graph is the least possible.

(2) "Density-cost graph" means a drawing having: (A) A horizontal or
base line divided into equal intervals of density, beginning with zero on the
left; and (B) a scale for per-student cost of transportation to be shown on a
line perpendicular to the base line at the left end thereof, such scale to
begin with zero dollars at the base line ascending by equal per-student cost
intervals.

 (3) "Index of density" means the number of students who areincluded in the enrollment of a school district in the current school year, are residing the designated distance or more by the usually traveled road from the school building they attend, and for whom transportation is being made available on regular school routes by the school district, divided by the number of square miles of territory in the school district.

7 (1) "Density figure" means the area of the school district in square 8 miles divided by the number of transported students.

9 (2) "Transported students" means the number of students who were 10 included in the enrollment of the school district in the preceding year who 11 resided $2^{1}/_{2}$ miles or more by the usually traveled road from the school 12 building such students attended and for whom transportation was made 13 available.

14 (e) The state board of education shall adopt a uniform policy or rule 15 and regulation that provides the method and electronic service resource 16 school districts shall use to calculate whether a student resides $2^{1}/_{2}$ miles 17 or more by the usually traveled road from the school building such student 18 attends and for whom transportation was made available.

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Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 72-5148 is hereby repealed.
