SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2386

As Recommended by House Committee on Federal and State Affairs

Brief*

HB 2386 would allow port authorities to sell real or personal property in a negotiated sale at less than its appraised value. In order to make such a sale, the port authority would be required to declare the sale would be in the public interest due to the return of new jobs, capital investment, or increased tax revenue. Current law prohibits port authorities from selling property below its appraised value.

Background

The bill was introduced by the House Committee on Federal and State Affairs at the request of Representative Karleskint. In the House Committee hearing, the Executive Director of the Leavenworth County Port Authority testified in support of the bill. No other testimony was provided.

According to the fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget, the Kansas Association of Counties and the League of Kansas Municipalities state enactment of the bill could lead to additional revenue for local governments with port authorities due to the return of new jobs, capital investment, or increased tax revenue associated with the sale of property at less than its appraised value. However, any fiscal effect would be negligible.
