SUBJECT: Written Testimony in Support of HB 2588

The City of Olathe has long believed that funding infrastructure for not only preservation, but also for growth and economic development, is essential to Kansas' future. Transportation investment is critical to our City's financial stability. Adequately funding both new and maintenance projects is critical, and if delayed, could cost many millions more. State investment into transportation creates opportunities for continued growth throughout the state ensuring Kansas, and its businesses, can compete both regionally and nationally.

While the term "investment" has been used for general spending, investment in the highway program has a real and tangible return. In Olathe's case, that includes addressing the traffic bottleneck at the I-35/Santa Fe interchange, identifying and funding options to address railroad challenges for economic development and traffic flow, improving state highway sections/partnerships at 169 Highway and addressing capacity along the eastern portion of K-10. All of which have measurable economic benefits.

Specifically, the City of Olathe supports the following provisions in the proposed FORWARD program:

- Rolling 2-year Plan: The City supports the proposal of a 2-year rolling program, where
 projects are selected for development and construction every two years. This will allow
 the program to respond more quickly to emerging needs while affording program
 flexibility throughout the length of the program.
- Prioritizing Preservation
- Alternative delivery: The City supports authorizing discretion for the Secretary to utilize alternate delivery methods when it is more efficient and cost-effective.

In addition, the City applauds Secretary Lorenz for putting together a program that does not require new funding, but instead funds it by restoring the sales tax transfer, bonding authority, and an increase in the local match. We urge lawmakers to support this funding plan and not redirect the existing sales tax revenue to fill other state budget needs.

The City of Olathe strongly supports HB 2558 and request your support for its passage.
