Dear Legislators,

I'm writing not only as a concerned mother, but as a citizens who is so thankful to be living in America where personal freedoms have always been championed. I'm asking that you do all that you can to protect our personal freedoms regarding medical care including vaccinations. We are people with unique needs and unique medical histories, not carbon copies that should be forced into the same mold.

My little girl was born full term at 4lbs 7oz. She wasn't a premie but she was the size of a premie. When it came time for her first shots she was still very very small and I just couldn't justify her needing to get so many shots all at once. Why would a 2 month old baby need a Heb B shot? I declined the Heb B shot at her 2 month visit, again at her 4 month visit, and also at her 6 month visit. My little girl is now almost 2 years old and she is now fully vaccinated against Heb B. She is behind schedule for some of her other shots, but I'm okay with that. That's they way I want it. I don't know if I will be able to put her in preschool when she is 4 because we many not get 100% caught up on the vaccine schedule. I wish that wasn't a requirement. I don't think it should be. But none-the-less, I'm not going to put my daughter at what I consider unnecessary risk by giving her too many shots all at once. No, I will home school her until she has received all her shots, spread out over time, to minimize the risk of vaccination damage. That's what I'm willing to do for medical freedom.
