**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for SB 331 by House Committee on Judiciary

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 331 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 331 would expand the Kansas Open Records Act as it applies to public website records that are searchable by a keyword and identify home addresses or home ownership to include employees of the Department of Corrections, local correctional officers, or local detention officers. The bill would permit such employees to file a request with the custodian of such records to have identifying information restricted from public access on public websites.

The Department of Corrections indicates that enactment of SB 331 would have no fiscal effect on the agency. The Department notes that enactment of the bill would provide new personal information protections which would lower some risks for its employees. The Office of the Attorney General indicates that enactment of the bill would have no fiscal effect on the agency.
