**Supporting Materials for Licensure of Anesthesiologist Assistants (AA)**

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## **SUMMARY**

The Kansas Legislature wisely established a process for the licensure of health care professionals. It begins with an application to the Kansas Department of Health & Environment prepared by proponents for a particular state health care licensure. The KDHE creates a Technical Review Committee where proponents and opponents present their points of view in an open and extended set of hearings. The Committee and then the Department Secretary make recommendations to the Legislature on the need and advisability for credentialing of a new health care professional.

That legislatively-created process has been followed with regard to the licensure of Anesthesiologist Assistants (AA). The KDHE recommended the licensure of AA's based on the clear and convincing evidence publicly submitted and debated before the Technical Review Committee. Health committees in both chambers have conducted hearings on similar bills creating a licensing procedure within the Board of Healing Arts.

Throughout this process, an association of Nurse Anesthetists (CRNA) has opposed the creation of a new category of provider whose role is to assist Anesthesiologists in caring for patients during surgeries. CRNA's claim that AA's are not adequately educated, that there is no shortage of CRNA's in Kansas, that licensure of AA's will reduce the number of training slots available for CRNA's, decrease the number of CRNA's in Kansas and various other unsubstantiated assertions.

By contrast you have before you evidence that there currently is a shortage of CRNA's in Kansas (dozens of vacancies across the state). You will also learn that there is no shortage in teaching slots with anesthesiology practices but rather a shortage of CRNA students to fill them. Hence, AA's won't be taking educational opportunities away from CRNA's when there simply aren't enough students to begin with.

You will see that while AA's and CRNA educational requirements are different, they are similar. AA's and CRNA's work side by side performing the exact same important health care services in an Anesthesiology Care Team (ACT) practice model in 16 other states, including 3 of our 4 neighboring states, Washington, D.C. and the territory of Guam, the VA system and Tricare. Renown hospitals in these states rely on AA's to care for delicate children and complicated surgeries.

Finally, you have evidence that AA licensing will not in any way damage the number or financial wellbeing of CRNA's in Kansas. In fact, you have evidence that in states that license AA's, the number of CRNA's continues to grow at the same rate as those states that don't allow AA's. Salaries for CRNA's and AA's are comparable in other states and CRNA salaries continue to grow nationwide.

In summary, this entire discussion ought to be about what benefits Kansas patients; not how to protect the CRNA's. The proponents of AA licensure stand ready to look for legislative compromises and to visit with the opponents on meaningful legislation to benefit those patients. To the extent that there may be legitimate concerns that lawmakers wish to resolve, the proponents are eager to address those concerns. Thank you for your consideration of our views.

Last legislative cycle (2017-2018) the Kansas Society of Anesthesiologists (KSA) and Kansas Academy of Anesthesiologist Assistant (KAAA) introduced legislation (House Bill No. 2046) to authorize and license a new health care provider in Kansas, to assist Physician Anesthesiologists. The provider would be known as an "Anesthesiologist Assistant" (AA).

In January 2017, a hearing was held by the House Committee on Health and Human Services. During the hearing, the Committee members encouraged the KSA and KAAA to complete the Credentialing of Health Care Personnel process at the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE). Following the Committee hearing the Chairman of the House Committee also requested that the KSA and KAAA meet with the Kansas Association of Nurse Anesthetists (KANA). During the first and only meeting, representatives of KANA supplied a list of concerns which related to their opposition to the legislation. Following this meeting, the KANA board of directors voted to discontinue discussions regarding the topic of AA licensure.

No additional action was taken by the House Committee in 2017.

In August of 2017, the KSA along with representatives of the AA community filed a Credentialing Application for Anesthesiologist Assistants with the Secretary of KDHE.

A second legislative hearing on the issue was held by the Committee on Health and Human Services in March of 2018. The purpose of this meeting was to update the committee on the status of the issue. We could only report that we were waiting on the KDHE Technical review committee to be established and no new activity with opponents due their refusal to meet with us.

Almost one year after submission of the request, the Technical Review committee was formally established by KDHE, under then Secretary Jeff Anderson and held its first meeting on the Credentialing Application for Anesthesiologist Assistants in August of 2018. Four public meetings were held from August to December of 2018. During the November, 2018 public hearing, the applicant, KSA and AA representatives, had the burden of establishing evidence of nine separate criteria, by a clear and convincing standard of proof (understandable and believable). At the final meeting in December, the Technical Review Committee discussed and voted in favor of

the applicant in each and every one of the nine criteria and a 10<sup>th</sup> vote was cast in favor of the recommendation and the application for licensing of anesthesiologist assistants. The final report recommending licensure of AA in Kansas by the Board of Healing Arts was signed by Lee Norman, the Secretary of KDHE.

In 2019, House Bill No. 2295 was introduced and heard by the House Committee on Health and Human Services and was "blessed" by the Speaker. Senate Bill No. 223, a similar measure to HB 2295, was introduced by the Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs and heard by the Senate Committee on Public Health and Welfare. Neither committee took action on the legislation.

The Special Committee on Health was appointed to study the licensure of anesthesiologist assistants by:

- Reviewing 2019 HB 2295;
- Considering economic impact of the proposed licensure;
- Holding a roundtable discussion of issues surrounding licensure; and
- Receiving information on the results of licensure in other states.

**FINAL REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE  
FROM THE KDHE SECRETARY ON THE APPLICATION FOR CREDENTIALING OF  
ANESTHESIOLOGIST ASSISTANTS**

On September 6, 2017, the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) received an application from the Kansas Society of Anesthesiologists for credentialing of the Anesthesiologist Assistants (Applicant). The application has been reviewed in accordance with the Kansas Act on Credentialing by a Technical Committee and the Secretary of KDHE. The Technical Committee conducted four fact-finding public meetings, including a public hearing to investigate the issues. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-5005, the Secretary is to issue a report to the Legislature after receiving the Technical Committee's report. The Technical Committee's report was submitted to the Secretary on January 11, 2019. (Attached is the Technical Committee's report). This is the final report of the Secretary to the Legislature.

The statute states that the Secretary is not bound by the recommendations of the Technical Committee, nor is the Legislature bound by the Secretary's recommendations.

K.S.A. 65-5005 requires that all of the criteria must be met and a need for credentialing be established prior to the Technical Committee or Secretary making a recommendation that the application be approved. The Technical Committee concluded that the all the Criteria required by K.S.A. 65-5006 was met by the Applicant.

**IN SUMMARY, THE TECHNICAL COMMITTEE FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS  
ARE AS FOLLOWS:**

**Criterion I**

**The unregulated practice of Anesthesiologist Assistants can harm or endanger the health, safety, or welfare of the public and the potential for such harm is recognizable and not remote.**

The majority of the members of the Technical Committee found that Criterion I was met. Five members of the Committee voted that Criterion I was met. Two members of the Committee voted that Criterion I was not met.

**Criterion II**

**The practice of Anesthesiologist Assistants requires an identifiable body of knowledge or proficiency in procedures, or both, acquired through a formal period of advanced study or training, and the public needs and will benefit by assurances of initial and continuing**

**occupational or professional ability.**

The majority of the members of the Technical Committee found that Criterion II was met. Five members of the Committee voted that Criterion II was met. Two members of the Committee voted that Criterion II was not met.

**Criterion III**

**If the practice of the Anesthesiologist Assistants is performed, for the most part, under the direction of other health care personnel or inpatient facilities providing health care services, such arrangement is not adequate to protect the public from persons performing non-credentialed functions and procedures.**

The majority of the members of the Technical Committee found that Criterion III was met. Five members of the Committee voted that Criterion III was met. Two members of the Committee voted that Criterion III was not met.

**Criterion IV**

**The public is not effectively protected from harm by certification of Anesthesiologist Assistants or by means other than credentialing.**

The majority of the members of the Technical Committee found that Criterion IV was met. Six members of the Committee voted that Criterion IV was met. One member of the Committee voted that Criterion IV was not met.

**Criterion V**

**The effect of credentialing of Anesthesiologists Assistants on the cost of health care to the public is minimal.**

The majority of the members of the Technical Committee found that Criterion V was met. Four members of the Committee voted that Criterion V was met. Three members of the Committee voted that Criterion V was not met.

**Criterion VI**

**The effect of credentialing of Anesthesiologist Assistants would have on the availability of health care personnel providing services provided by such occupation or profession is minimal.**

The majority of the members of the Technical Committee found that Criterion VI was met. Four members of the Committee voted that Criterion VI was met. Three members of the Committee voted that Criterion VI was not met.



**Criterion VII**

**The scope of practice of the Anesthesiologist Assistants is identifiable.**

The members of the Technical Committee voted unanimously that Criterion VII was met.

**Criterion VIII**

**The effect of credentialing of Anesthesiologist Assistants on the scope of practice of other health care personnel, whether or not credentialed under state law, is minimal.**

The majority of the members of the Technical Committee found that Criterion VIII was met. Four members of the Committee voted that Criterion VIII was met. Three members of the Committee voted that Criterion VIII was not met.

**Criterion IX**

**Nationally recognized standards of education and training exist for the practice of Anesthesiologist Assistants and are identifiable.**

The members of the Technical Committee voted unanimously that Criterion IX was met.


**Credentialing recommendation of the Technical Committee:**

**Criterion X**

Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-5001(a)(b)(c) and (d), six members of the Technical Committee voted that the level of credentialing should be licensure. One member voted no. Criterion X passed six to one.

**The Secretary of Health and Environment's Findings and Recommendations Are:**

After consideration of the Technical Committee's report, and the evidence and testimony presented to the committee, I concur with the Technical Committee's Findings and Recommendations. I find by clear and convincing evidence that the Applicant met all the criteria required by K.S.A. 65-5006. Based on the findings, evidence of record and recommendations, the level of credentialing of the Anesthesiologist Assistants should be licensure to protect the public from harm. The Kansas Board of Healing Arts shall be responsible for this credentialing process and the level of credentialing. (K.S.A. 65-5005).

# Certified Anesthesiologist Assistants

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## AA Professional Overview

### Professional Definition

Certified Anesthesiologist Assistants (CAAs) are highly skilled health professionals who work under the direction of licensed physician Anesthesiologists to implement anesthesia care plans. CAAs work exclusively within the Anesthesia Care Team model as described by the American Society of Anesthesiologists (ASA). The goal of AA education is to guide the transformation of qualified student applicants into competent health care practitioners who aspire to work in the Anesthesia Care Team for the benefit of patients.

All CAAs must complete a comprehensive didactic and clinical program at the **graduate school level**. To be admitted into an AA training program, students must have earned a baccalaureate degree with premedical coursework. AAs are trained extensively in the delivery and maintenance of quality anesthesia care as well as advanced patient monitoring techniques. AAs perform such tasks as administering drugs, obtaining vascular access, applying and interpreting monitors, establishing and maintaining patient airway, and assisting with preoperative assessment. AAs train and work under the supervision of physician Anesthesiologists who retain responsibility for the immediate care of the patient. The care team model expands the medical treatment provided by the physician Anesthesiologist and equips the medical facility to serve patients more effectively and efficiently.

### History

In the early 1960s, leaders in the medical specialty of Anesthesiology recognized the existence of staffing shortages. To meet growing demands and to accommodate the increasing complexity of anesthesia and surgery, three Anesthesiologists (Drs. Gravenstein, Steinhaus and Volpito) proposed the concept of an "anesthesia technologist" who would be a member of the anesthesia team and would be considered an "applied physiologist". This was the precursor to what is now the Certified Anesthesiologist Assistant. The doctors designed an educational program whereby students would build on undergraduate premedical training then earn a master's degree in Anesthesiology. The concept became reality in 1969 when the first AA training program began accepting students at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia, followed shortly thereafter by a program at Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio.

In 1989, the National Commission for Certification of Anesthesiologist Assistants (NCCAA) was established to create a national certification process. Since 2002, there has been a significant expansion of AA education programs in the US. Today, the ASA fully supports Anesthesiologist Assistants and the expansion of AA licensure and practice across the nation.

### Scope of Practice

The scope of CAA clinical practice is generally the same as that of nurse anesthetists on the Anesthesia Care Team. The local scope of practice of CAAs is usually defined by the following:

- The medically directing Anesthesiologist
- The hospital credentialing body
- The state's board of medicine
- Any applicable state statute or regulation.

## Practice Locations

Certified Anesthesiologist Assistants enjoy career pathways in a dynamic profession that continues to realize exponential growth as evidenced by the addition of new training sites and new states opening to AA practice. States, territories and districts in which CAAs work by license, regulation, and/or certification:

## Recognized by Federal Government

CAAs may practice at any Veterans Affairs facility in all 50 states.

The federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) recognizes both Certified AAs and Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists (CRNAs) as non-physician anesthesia providers. Similarly, commercial insurance payers make no distinction between the two anesthetist types with regard to payments for services provided under medical direction by a physician Anesthesiologist.

## Standard: Organization and Staffing

The organization of Anesthesia services must be appropriate to the scope of the services offered. Anesthesia must be administered only by the following providers:

- A qualified physician Anesthesiologist;
- A doctor of medicine or osteopathy (other than an Anesthesiologist);
- A dentist, oral surgeon, or podiatrist who is qualified to administer anesthesia under state law;
- A CRNA, as defined in § 410.69(b) of the Federal Register, “who is under the supervision of the operating practitioner or of an Anesthesiologist who is immediately available if needed”; or
- An AA, as defined in § 410.69(b) of the Federal Register, “who is under the supervision of an Anesthesiologist who is immediately available if needed.”

Here is an example of UMKC pre-req information

- Applicants for admission to the MSA program must have earned, or will soon earn, a baccalaureate degree or higher from a regionally-accredited U.S. or Canadian college/university.
- It is recommended that applicants earn a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Applicants must complete the following pre-requisite courses prior to matriculation, with a pre-requisite GPA of 3.0 or higher. It is required that applicants receive a grade of C or better in pre-requisite courses:
  - Two semesters of biology with lab
  - Two semesters of general chemistry with lab
  - One semester of organic chemistry I with lab
  - One semester of organic chemistry II with lab
  - Two semesters of physics (sophomore level) with lab
  - One semester of biochemistry (upper-level)\*
  - One semester of human anatomy
  - One semester of physiology\*
    - One semester of human anatomy and physiology (4+ credit hour course) may be accepted for one semester of human anatomy and one semester of physiology.
  - Two semesters of mathematics (calculus, pre-calculus, statistics, college algebra or trigonometry)
  - One course in medical terminology

*\*Those courses marked with an asterisk must have been completed within five years of the application deadline.*

- The MSA program will allow a student to complete any missing required courses after the application deadline. Any offers of admission will be contingent upon successful completion of the required courses by the end of the fall semester before matriculation in January. Once enrolled in the course(s), a student must submit, prior to the interview, a transcript to the School of Medicine Office of Admissions showing the course(s) in progress. A final transcript with a final grade in the course(s) must be submitted upon completion of the course(s).
- Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate credit is accepted for pre-requisite courses; however grades earned in such courses will not be used when calculating the pre-requisite GPA.
- Due to the knowledge base of each semester building on the knowledge base from the previous semester, it is vital that all students in the UMKC Master of Science in Anesthesia program complete the courses required within the curriculum in the prescribed sequence. Advanced placement, transfer of credit from other educational programs, or substitution of coursework based on prior academic or clinical experience will not be accepted in place of the prescribed courses in the MSA program curriculum.

#### **MCAT Score**

- The Medical College Admissions Test is required.
- MCAT scores must have been earned within three years of the application deadline. The latest MCAT score accepted for the Final Application deadline is the May MCAT.

- Currently, there is no minimum score required for admission. The recommended minimum on the MCAT taken in 2014 or before is a 22 composite score. The recommended minimum on the 2015 MCAT is a 494 composite score.
- When the MCAT has been taken more than once, component scores from different exams may not be combined. The highest MCAT score earned by an applicant will be used in the application.
- All applicants must submit official MCAT scores to CASAA after self-reporting their MCAT scores and entering their AAMC ID number into the CASAA application. Applicants should contact AAMC to request their official scores to be released to CASAA following the self-reporting of their score and identification information.

**Shadowing Experience**

- Experience shadowing an anesthesia provider (anesthesiologist, Anesthesiologist Assistant or CRNA) is required prior to the application deadline.
- A minimum of ten (10) hours of shadowing experience is required.

To successfully verify shadowing experience, applicants must either use the electronic Shadowing Experience Verification Form provided through the UMKC student portal (after the CASAA application has been verified) or submit a printed version via U.S. mail.

*Brief course descriptions:*

**ANES 5505 Anatomy for Anesthesiologist Assistants I**

A one credit hour course designed specifically for anesthesiologist assistants. Anatomical terms, structures, and relationships emphasizing functional significance in problem solving situations. Laboratory provides demonstrations using models and other learning modalities.

**ANES 5506 Anatomy for Anesthesiologist Assistants II**

In this course, students will learn to apply the anatomy that directly impacts clinical situations. Diagnostic skills will be enhanced through an understanding of radiologic tests, identification of common chest X-rays, and a basic understanding of transesophageal echocardiography. Students will learn to recognize the basic 4 chamber TEE views and diagnose the most common lesions and abnormalities in patients undergoing cardiac surgery. An ultrasound machine will be used to identify anatomy for a variety of clinical procedures, including intravenous line placement, central line placement, arterial line placement, and peripheral nerve block placement. Students will learn the principles of how to operate and manipulate the ultrasound monitor, and will learn the relevant anatomy and anesthetic implications and management for the most common peripheral nerve blocks used today. In addition, clinically significant anatomy case studies in anesthesia will be presented and discussed.

**ANES 5518/ ANES 5528/ ANES 5538 Professionalism for the Anesthesiologist Assistant I/ II/ III** This is a 0.5 credit course required in the first three semesters of the program which involves detailed study into special areas of Anesthesiologist Assistant practice; including professional behavior towards colleagues and patients, psychological considerations in providing anesthesia care, ethical considerations in medicine, and diversity, legal obligations of anesthetists and the rights of their patients, and the social and community contexts of health care. It further details the need for lifelong commitment to self-education in the practice of anesthesia and positive advocacy of the anesthesiologist assistant profession.

**ANES 5540 Patient Monitoring and Instrumentation I** This is a three-credit hour course which integrates concepts of circuits and engineering with the clinical application of anesthesia instrumentation. Monitors and devices used in the operating room are studied with respect to principles of operation, calibration, and interpretation of data. A hands-on laboratory is used to maximize direct contact to the instrumentation of the profession.

**ANES 5541/ ANES 5577 Methods of Anesthesia I/ II** This course addresses intraoperative monitoring for complicated patients and complex surgical procedures. Advanced and supplemental monitors and devices used in the operating room are studied with respect to principles of operation, calibration, and interpretation of data. Includes focus on diagnosis and practical applications of electrocardiography (ECG), echocardiography and other advanced cardiovascular monitoring techniques used in the operating room.

**ANES 5548 Senior Seminar** This is a 0.5 credit hour course taken in the final semester of the Master of Science in Anesthesia Program. This course is designed to prepare the student for the job market and placement. The course will contain information on student loan payback, financial literacy after graduation, and leadership opportunities for the graduate. The course will also clinically update the students in basic life saving for the healthcare provider (BLS), advanced cardiac life-saving (ACLS) and pediatric advanced life-saving (PALS).

**ANES 5556/ ANES 5557 Physiology for Anesthesiologist Assistants I/ II** These courses were designed specifically for the Masters of Anesthesia Program. Students learn basic and applied human systems physiology with emphasis on topics and areas of special concern to the anesthetist.

**ANES 5558/ ANES 5559 Anesthesia and Coexisting Disease I/ II** These courses provide an essential anesthesia link to the basic anatomy and physiology classes in the Masters of Science in Anesthesia program. The content outline intentionally corresponds with and builds upon that of the Physiology for Anesthesiologist Assistants coursework.

**ANES 5560 Introduction to Anesthesia** This two credit hour course prepares students for practice in anesthesia by introducing basic concepts and necessary skills. It also provides intensive instruction regarding: Medical terminology and abbreviations, medical record and medical history interpretation, and documentation skills.

**ANES 5561 Orientation to Simulation and Clinical Application** A skills lab based course to prepare students for anesthesia patient care in the operating room. Classroom, simulation laboratory and actual operating room environments will be used to teach preoperative assessment, IV placement techniques, airway management, intraoperative patient care and post-operative management. BLS (Basic Life Support) certification is a course requirement.

**ANES 5563/ ANES 5565 / ANES 5567 Anesthesia Clinical Experience I/II/III** A continuation of ANES 5561 with increasing clinical experience each semester. Laboratory work focuses on refining patient management skill, establishing independence in performing basic tasks and introducing advanced skills. Students gain additional clinical experience in the operating room. In this course it is expected students will be successful in performing basic clinical competencies with minimal assistance from clinical instructors, while attempting advanced competencies with frequent assistance.

**ANES 5564/ ANES 5568/ ANES 5570 Anesthesia Clinical Correlation II/III/IV** This one credit course is designed to help students understand how to effectively research and apply current anesthesia journal articles, and to prepare for the NCCAA certification examination. The students will spend the entire semester studying specific topics of the 16 focus areas that are included on the NCCAA certification examination. Homework will include submission of test questions based on their presentations and the assigned NCCAA testing topics. The students will also receive an assignment to find and summarize a journal article from a specific aspect of anesthesia. The students will cap off the semester with a clinical final examination, which includes submitted questions from assigned topics. Clinical correlation II includes an IT week provided at the School of Medicine.

**ANES 5569/ ANES 5571/ ANES 5573 Anesthesia Clinical Experience IV/V/VI** These are clinical clerkships, where students are in the operating room (OR) five days per week and through the combined clinical experience clerkships will receive extended exposure to all clinical subspecialties. Students complete 4 week or 8 week rotations at several area hospitals to gain experience with general surgery, obstetrics, pediatrics, trauma surgery, neurosurgery, cardiovascular surgery, orthopedic surgery, and others. Students are expected to perform basic clinical competencies with minimal to no assistance from clinical



instructors, while attempting advanced competencies with frequent assistance.

**ANES 5575/ ANES 5576 Pharmacology for Anesthesiologist Assistants I/ II** These courses specifically designed for the Master of Science in Anesthesia program will introduce the student to basic concepts in pharmacology: principles of drug action, receptor theory, pharmacokinetics, and pharmacodynamics. The courses will emphasize those medication classes most commonly encountered within the practice of an anesthesiologist assistant including anesthetic agents (inhaled, intravenous, local), analgesics, cardiovascular agents and intravenous fluids.

**ANES 5585/ ANES 5586 Physiological Model-based Simulation I/ II** These are two credit hour courses, which utilize physiological model-based simulation and procedure simulation to integrate anesthesia-associated basic science knowledge into a laboratory setting. Students practice basic manual skills in: anesthesia machine checkout, anesthesia materials and equipment setup and performing anesthesia for uncomplicated surgical cases using clinical models and simulators. Students are also introduced to anesthesia machine troubleshooting and crisis management.

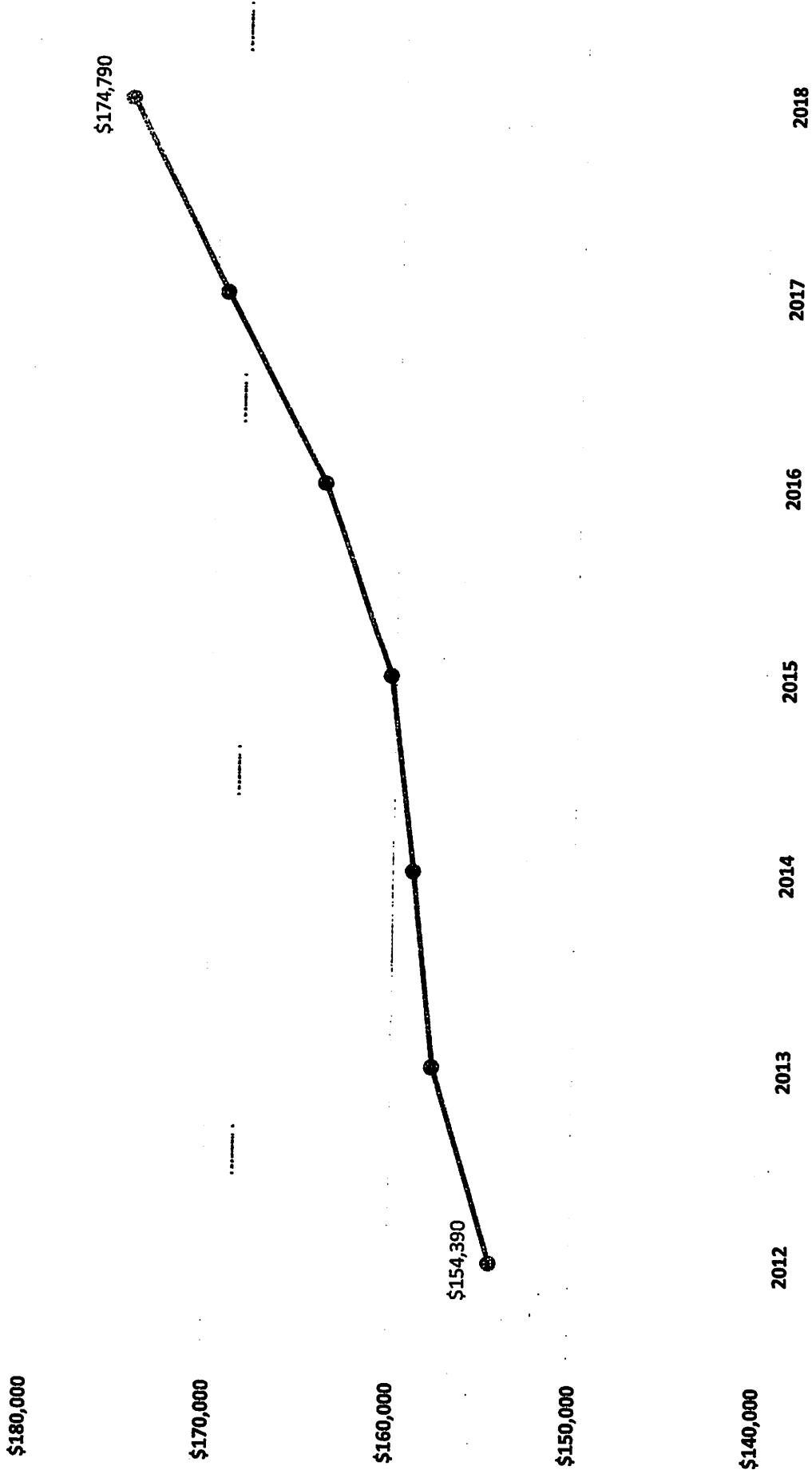
**MEDPA 5503 Research Applications in Medicine** This one semester course introduces the student to clinical research in medicine and its application to clinical decision making through the concepts and principles of evidence-based medicine. Additionally, the course will provide the student with the skills to complete a written research project through the investigation of a clinical topic utilizing the medical literature. In addition to the lecture, students will participate in small group assignments designed to provide hands-on experience in research design, analysis, and evaluation of published literature. Will also include instruction and utilization of the Health Sciences library and associated resources.

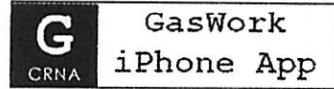
# Nurse Anesthetists U.S. Mean Annual Wage
