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Historically the Department of Commerce has not housed finance options for small businesses

Partnership with Network Kansas

Needed to adapt to what businesses were dealing with

Brought forward two options to date to help addresses the ever-evolving needs businesses have as a result of COVID-19:

- HIRE Fund
- Business Grant Program

HIRE Fund

Overview

Hospitality Industry Relief Emergency Fund to support the state's hospitality businesses

Launched on March 20th, 2020

We partnered with Network Kansas to provide \$5 million in shortterm, zero-interest loans for Kansas' hospitality sector during the COVID-19 crisis

The \$5 million in funding for HIRE came from the Job Creation Fund ("JCF"), which is the state's deal closing fund. Typically, JCF is used for recruiting outside businesses into the state, but retention of existing businesses is a permitted use under the statute. We are proud to have deployed JCF in a manner that prioritized existing Kansas businesses.

- Examples include
 - Restaurants
 - Bars
 - Lodging
 - Conference/Event Centers



Eligible Use of Funds (Not limited to)

- Commercial loan payments
- Commercial lease payments
- Utility bills
- Payroll
- Accounts payable
- Inventory



Applicant Eligibility

Be an existing for-profit business located in Kansas

- Maintain a staff of fewer than 100 employees
- Have no outstanding state tax obligations
- Be willing to submit a personal guarantee of repayment from the owners of the business



Distribution Overview

We received almost 900 applications within the first 24 hours and have received 1,800 applications to date

344 loans were allocated with an average loan amount of \$14,500

Douglas, Johnson, Shawnee and Wyandotte counties: \$2 million to 136 businesses

Sedgwick County: \$1 million to 68 companies

The remaining \$2 million was allocated to 140 businesses throughout the state

Currently we do not have any more funding available

But we have left open potential possibilities if things change



Business Grants (allocated by SPARK)

In Phase 2, SPARK asked agencies to provide the committee with potential solutions on how to address the needs of Kansans

Department of Commerce presented a Business Grants program to address the needs of small businesses and the need to provide a safe environment for all Kansans

- The Proposal breaks down into four categories:
 - \$32.5 million in small business & non-profit grants
 - \$7 million in grants related to COVID R&D and product development
 - \$22 million in grants for in-state COVID-related and PPE manufacturing



Small Business Grants

Overview

Central online portal for all applications

In order to be eligible for the grant, businesses must be under 500 employees, will have to demonstrate 25% loss or greater over six months before the pandemic and must provide an intended use of funds

Must meet the guidelines set forth by the CARES Act and guidance provided by the Treasury Department

Will be working with Private Sector Partnerships in order to help with review process

COVID R&D

Overview

How can State contribute to helping end the pandemic

We are going to need rapid testing, treatment solutions and other developments in bioscience

Goal with these funds is to help provide funding towards product development to address these issues in the coming months

Must meet federal guidance that product directly be linked to COVID



PPE Manufacturing & Grants

Overview

Help supply chain and provide incentive for additional PPE production in the State

Looking at in-state options for PPE production and manufacturing

Help provide funding to businesses who need to acquire PPE and other related materials for a safe workplace

Demonstrate need for training/equipment/modifications to improve health of workers or customers
