Since March 15, KDOL has paid out more than **2.4 million weekly claims** totaling over **\$1.9 billion** between regular unemployment, and the federal pandemic programs.



KDOL Fraud Mitigation



Fraud Mitigation

- Partnership with U.S. Department of Labor Office of the Inspector General.
- Hired a fulltime security officer (KISO) for better OITS coordination and analysis.
- More than doubled the size of the KDOL Fraud & Special Investigation Unit.
- Put in place a 72-hour hold on all <u>new</u> PUA applications to allow for a validity check to be completed.
- Blocking financial institutions with disproportionately high levels of suspicious transactions.
- KDOL Legal is conducting **review of existing laws** for permissibility of other measures.

- Deployed specialized technologies to target and block abusive IP addresses and malicious bot activity.
- Weekly communication with National Association of State Workforce Agencies (NASWA) on emerging trends and best practices.
- Partnership with NASWA and utilizing their Integrity Data Hub.
- Launched <u>www.ReportFraud.ks.gov</u>.
- Developing a messaging campaign for the general public and businesses about identity theft and unemployment insurance fraud.

Lost Wage Assistance (LWA) Program



Timeline for the Lost Wage Assistance (LWA) Program

- **August 8:** President Trump issued executive memorandum creating the LWA program, providing up to **\$400** in supplemental payments to Americans on unemployment.
- August 10: Application process opened by FEMA.
- August 12: Initial program guidance issued by FEMA.
- August 17: Actual program guidance issued by FEMA.
- August 27: Governor Kelly announced Kansas' intention to apply for the LWA program.
- September 2: SPARK Taskforce gives \$400 LWA approval.
- September 3: State Finance Council rejects \$400 LWA proposal.
- **September 4:** KDOL applies to FEMA for \$300 LWA proposal. No additional input from SPARK or SFC needed.
- **September 7:** FEMA approved Kansas' grant application.
- September 9: States informally told that LWA would only be guaranteed for six weeks. No official guidance yet.
- September 10: First half of LWA funding received.
- September 14: KDOL applied for last half of LWA funding.
- End of September: KDOL expected to begin paying out LWA funds.

Lost Wage Assistance (LWA) Program

- Allows states to provide up to \$400 in additional unemployment benefits each week to eligible claimants.
- Eligible claimants in Kansas will receive \$300 per week.
- In addition to the normal requirements for unemployment programs, each claimant must:
 - ✓ Self-certify that their unemployment or under employment is caused by the COVID-19 pandemic;
 - ✓ Be receiving at least \$100 in unemployment benefits from another program.

Lost Wage Assistance (LWA) Program

- The earliest benefits could be payable is late September.
- Payments will be paid back to August 1, 2020 the first week of program eligibility.
- FEMA has notified KDOL that funds will be available through the week ending September 5, 2020 — six weeks total.
- KDOL IT has started implementation of the program.
 - Implementation costs can not be paid using existing federal administrative funds. States will receive up to 5% of the grant to fund administrative costs.
 States must provide a 25% match of that funding. KDOL paying for state match from Penalties and Interest Fund.
