My name is Coach Tyler Carrel, a representative of PSA (Patterson Sports Academy), which is an organization for young athletes. We are mainly made up of young ladies from the age of 6 to 22 that are more family than teammates. Our organization is based on the belief of building these young athletes in the sport they love but more importantly in life and Faith. These are strong young athletes and even stronger human beings that truly care for each other and the communities they live in.

They have been asked to do many things over the last few months from learning to do their studies online, social distance from their friends and loved ones to stay away from everything the know to be normal. They have been strong and extremely compliant with these ask even though it has caused them to struggle in many new ways. They were told by many of us and our government that if they followed the rules and guidelines, they would see friends and family again soon. They were told if they followed,

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We have asked a lot of ourselves as a country these past few months but we have asked even more of our young people. They are starting to struggle to find ways to stay healthy both mentally and physically during these times. As coaches we know that for many of these athletes, we are their sense of normalcy. We are their sense of family and faith. Sports in so many cases may be the place these athletes can seek refuge from broken homes or even mental health issues. They look to their coaches and team as a beacon of hope and the inspiration to carry on in life. We are calm, we are their strength, we are their refuge. If we delay in allowing these athletes to take the field, we are saying that we put politics first and not these amazing young people. I beg of you to do the right thing and get these athletes back to their safe place, between the lines and on the field.
