**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for HB 2082 by House Committee on Health and Human Services

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2082 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2082 would authorize a licensed pharmacist to administer a drug by injection to a patient with a prescription order, unless the prescription specifically prohibits such administration.

According to the Board of Pharmacy, enactment of HB 2082 would have a fiscal effect on expenditures of the Board. The bill would require compliance monitoring in the course of routine pharmacy inspections and investigating any complaints received. Expenditures would increase with additional staff time and resources for inspections and investigations to ensure compliance with state law. The Board estimates total associated staff time for a licensed pharmacy inspector salary would equate to approximately \$11,600 per year. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2082 is not reflected in *The FY 2020 Governor's Budget Report*.
