SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2621 by House Committee on Agriculture

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2621 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2621 would allow the Secretary of Wildlife, Parks, and Tourism to purchase land in Kingman County.

The Department of Wildlife, Parks, and Tourism states the property that would be purchased in FY 2021 is adjacent to Byron Walker Wildlife Area in Kingman County. The agency does not have an estimate of the purchase price because the property has not been appraised. The agency does indicate that there would be a cost to maintain the grounds; however, the estimate is unknown. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2621 is not reflected in *The FY 2021 Governor's Budget Report*.
