SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 169 by Senate Committee on Utilities

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 169 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 169 would require revenue collected for the operator certification fee to be deposited into the Water Program Management Fee Fund rather than the State General Fund. The bill would also increase the fee from a limit of \$25 to a limit of \$125.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment indicates that SB 169 would allow the agency to retain all fees collected for operator certification, estimated to be \$50,000 for FY 2020, rather than be deposited into the State General Fund. The agency would no longer need a State General Fund appropriation of \$50,000. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 169 is not reflected in *The FY 2020 Governor's Budget Report*.
