**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for SB 461 by Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 461 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

Under current law, a high-risk missing person means a person who is at a heightened risk of bodily harm or death, including, but not limited to a person missing: as a result of an abduction; under suspicious or known dangerous circumstances; for more than 30 days; who has been designated as a high-risk missing person by another law enforcement agency; or under any facts or circumstances that would lead the law enforcement agency to believe such person may be at risk of bodily harm or death. SB 461 would amend the definition of a high-risk missing person to include children in the custody of the Secretary for Children and Families.

The Department for Children and Families states that enactment of the bill would not have a fiscal effect.
