**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for SB 467 by Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 467 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 467 would establish the Camo Alert system, which would allow public notices of a missing military member to be promptly broadcast in cooperation with local law enforcement, news media and the general public. The Camo Alert system would be implemented by the Office of the Attorney General in collaboration with the Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI), the Kansas Highway Patrol (KHP), local law enforcement agencies, and other public and private agencies or organizations.

The Office of the Attorney General and the KBI indicate the bill would have no fiscal effect on their agencies. The Office notes that the KBI is the state's lead agency on missing persons and the KBI would manage the Camo Alert system along with the alert programs currently managed by the Bureau, which include the Amber Alert, Blue Alert and the Silver Alert. The KHP indicates the bill would have no fiscal effect on KHP operations.
