## **HOUSE BILL No. 2235**

AN ACT concerning executive branch state employment; relating to tax clearance certificates for **individuals offered a** job—applicants and employees; when required.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a)—No applicant for **Any individual offered** a job with the state or any agency thereof shall be required to obtain or provide proof of a tax clearance certificate from the department of revenue as part of an employment application.

- (b) If—an applicant is hired any individual is offered a job by any agency in the executive branch of the state, the—employee individual must apply for a tax clearance certificate from the department of revenue within 15 days of the—employee's hire date on which the individual is offered a job. The tax clearance process will review whether the—employee—individual is current and compliant with all Kansas tax laws administered by the department of revenue; and taxes, fees or payments administered by the department of labor; and other various fees or charges administered by any other state agency.
- (c) Documents, materials or other information obtained by or disclosed to the department of revenue for the purpose of obtaining a tax clearance certificate and the results of the tax compliance review shall be confidential and shall not be subject to disclosure under the Kansas open records act. The provisions of this subsection shall expire on July 1, 2024, unless the legislature reviews and reenacts this provision pursuant to K.S.A. 45-229, and amendments thereto, prior to July 1, 2024.

  (d) If the <u>employee</u> individual cannot provide proof of a tax compliance certificate, the <u>employee</u> individual shall enter into a payment
- plan with the department of revenue and remain current on such payment plan as a condition of continued employment with the respective agency.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
