AN ACT concerning motor vehicles; relating to distinctive license plates; 1 2 changing the requirements for distinctive and educational institution 3 license plate production; providing for the proud educator, alpha 4 kappa alpha, knights of Columbus and current and veteran members 5 of the United States army, navy, marine corps, air force and coast guard license plates; amending K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-1,141-and, 8-6 7 1,142 and 8-1,147 and repealing the existing sections. 8 9 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:* 10 Section 1. K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-1,141 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-1,141. (a) Any new distinctive license plate authorized for 11 12 issuance on and after July 1, 1994, shall be subject to the personalized license plate fee prescribed by K.S.A. 8-132(c), and amendments thereto. 13 14 This section shall not apply to any distinctive license plate authorized prior 15 to July 1, 1994. 16 (b) The director of vehicles shall not issue any new distinctive license 17 plate authorized for issuance on and after July 1, 1995, unless there is a 18 guarantee of an initial issuance of at least-500 250 license plates. 19 (c) The provisions of this section shall not apply to distinctive license 20 plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,145, and amendments thereto, or K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-177d, 8-1,163, 8-1,166, 8-1,185, 8-1,186, 21 22 8-1,187-or, 8-1,188, section 6, section 7, section 8, section 9 or section 23 10. and amendments thereto. 24 (d) The provisions of subsection (a), shall not apply to distinctive 25 license plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,146 or 8-1,148, 26 and amendments thereto, or K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-1,153, 8-1,158 or 8-27 1,161, and amendments thereto. 28 (e) The provisions of subsection (f) shall not apply to distinctive 29 license plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-1,160 30 and 8-1,183, and amendments thereto, except that the division shall delay 31 the manufacturing and issuance of such distinctive license plate until the 32 division has received not less than 1,000 orders for such plate, including 33 payment of the personalized license plate fee required under subsection 34 (a). Upon certification by the director of vehicles to the director of 35 accounts and reports that not less than 1,000 paid orders for such plate 36 have been received, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer

1 \$40,000 from the state highway fund to the distinctive license plate fund.

(f) (1) Any person or organization sponsoring any distinctive license
plate authorized by the legislature on and after July 1, 2004, shall submit
to the division of vehicles a nonrefundable amount not to exceed \$20,000
\$5,000, to defray the division's cost for developing such distinctive license
plate.

7 (2) All moneys received under this subsection shall be remitted by the 8 secretary of revenue to the state treasurer in accordance with the 9 provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of 10 each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the distinctive license plate fund which is 11 12 hereby created in the state treasury. All moneys credited to the distinctive 13 license plate fund shall be used by the department of revenue only for the purpose associated with the development of distinctive license plates. All 14 15 expenditures from the distinctive license plate application fee fund shall be 16 made in accordance with appropriation acts, upon warrants of the director 17 of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the 18 secretary of the department of revenue.

(g) (1) Except for educational institution license plates issued under
K.S.A. 8-1,142, and amendments thereto, the director of vehicles shall
discontinue the issuance of any distinctive license plate authorized prior to
July 1, 2004, and which is subject to the provisions of subsection (b) if:

(A) Less than 500 license plates, including annual renewals, are issued for that distinctive license plate by July 1, 2006; and

(B) less than 250 125 license plates, including annual renewals, are
 issued for that distinctive license plate during any subsequent two-year
 period after July 1, 2006.

(2) The director of vehicles shall discontinue the issuance of anydistinctive license plate authorized on and after July 1, 2004, if:

30 (A) Less than-500 250 plates, including annual renewals, are issued 31 for that distinctive license plate by the end of the second year of sales; and

(B) less than-250 125 license plates, including annual renewals, are
 issued for that distinctive license plate during any subsequent two-year
 period.

35 (h) An application for any distinctive license plate issued after 36 December 31, 2012, and the corresponding royalty fee may be collected 37 either by the county treasurer or the entity benefiting from the issuance of 38 the distinctive license plate. Annual royalty payments collected by the 39 county treasurers shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with 40 the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt 41 of each such remittance the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount 42 in the state treasury to the credit of a segregated royalty fund which shall 43 be administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures from the royalty

1 fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of

the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved
by the state treasurer or the state treasurer's designee. Payments from the
royalty fund shall be made to the entity benefiting from the issuance of the
distinctive license plate on a monthly basis.

6 (i) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for any distinctive 7 license plate, the division shall produce such distinctive license plate for a 8 motorcycle upon request to the division by the organization sponsoring the 9 distinctive license plate.

(j) In addition to any residency requirements for all distinctive license
plates, any person not a resident of Kansas, serving as a member of the
armed forces stationed in this state shall be eligible to apply for any
distinctive license plate as if the individual was a resident of this state.
Such person shall be eligible to renew the distinctive license plate
registration as long as the person is still stationed in this state at the time
the registration is renewed.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-1,142 is hereby amended to read as
follows: 8-1,142. (a) As used in this section, "educational institution"
means:

(1) Any state educational institution under the control and supervisionof the state board of regents;

(2) any municipal university;

(3) any not-for-profit independent institution of higher education
which is accredited by the north central association of colleges and
secondary schools accrediting agency based on its requirements as of April
1, 1985, is operated independently and not controlled or administered by
the state or any agency or subdivision thereof, maintains open enrollment
and the main campus or principal place of operation of which is located in
Kansas;

30 (4) any community college organized and operating under the laws of31 this state; and

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(5) Haskell Indian Nations university.

33 (b) Any owner or lessee of one or more passenger vehicles, trucks 34 registered for a gross weight of not more than 20,000 pounds or 35 motorcycles, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance with the 36 provisions of this section, may be issued one educational institution license 37 plate for each such passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle. Such license 38 plates shall be issued for the same period of time as other license plates 39 upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided 40 in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, plus the payment of an 41 additional fee of \$5 for each plate, and either the payment to the county 42 treasurer of the logo use royalty payment established by the alumni 43 association or foundation or the presentation of the annual emblem use

1 authorization statement provided for in subsection (c).

2 (c) Any educational institution may authorize through its officially 3 recognized alumni association or foundation the use of such institution's 4 official emblems to be affixed on license plates as provided by this section. 5 Any royalty payment derived from this section, except reasonable 6 administrative costs, shall be used for recognition of academic 7 achievement or excellence subject to the approval of the chancellor or 8 president of the educational institution. Any motor vehicle owner or lessee 9 may annually apply to the alumni association or foundation for the use of 10 the institution's emblems. Upon annual application and payment to either: (1) The alumni association or foundation in an amount of not less than \$25 11 12 nor more than \$100 as an emblem use royalty payment for each 13 educational institution license plate to be issued, the alumni association or foundation shall issue to the motor vehicle owner or lessee, without further 14 15 charge, an emblem use authorization statement, which shall be presented 16 by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time of registration; or (2) the 17 county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment for each license plate to 18 be issued.

19 (d) Any applicant for an educational institution license plate may 20 make application for such plates not less than 60 days prior to such 21 person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished 22 by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for the educational institution 23 license plates shall provide either the annual emblem use authorization 24 statement provided for in subsection (c) or pay to the county treasurer the 25 logo use royalty payment established by the alumni association or foundation. Application for registration of a passenger vehicle, truck or 26 27 motorcycle and issuance of the license plates under this section shall be 28 made by the owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of 29 vehicles upon forms furnished by the director.

(e) No registration or educational institution license plate issuedunder this section shall be transferable to any other person.

32 (f) The director of vehicles may transfer educational institution33 license plates from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

34 (g) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made 35 annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (b), in the 36 manner prescribed in subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-132, and amendments 37 thereto. No renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until 38 such applicant provides to the county treasurer either the annual emblem 39 use authorization statement provided for in subsection (c) or the payment 40 of the annual emblem use royalty payment established by the alumni 41 association or foundation. If such emblem use authorization statement is 42 not presented at the time of registration or faxed by the alumni association 43 or foundations, or the annual emblem use royalty payment is not made to

1 the county treasurer, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A.

8-143, and amendments thereto, and return the educational institutionlicense plates to the county treasurer of such person's residence.

4 (h) The director of vehicles shall not issue any educational institution 5 license plates for any educational institution, unless such educational 6 institution's alumni association or foundation guarantees the initial 7 issuance of at least-500 100 license plates.

8 (i) The director of vehicles shall discontinue the issuance of an 9 educational institution's license plate authorized under this section if:

10 (1) Less than-500 100 educational institution license plates, including 11 annual renewals, are issued for an educational institution by the end of the 12 second year of sales; and

(2) less than-250 50 educational institution license plates, including
 annual renewals, are issued for an educational institution during any
 subsequent two-year period.

16 (j) Each educational institution's alumni association or foundation 17 shall:

18 (1) Pay the initial cost of silk-screening design for such educational19 license plates; and

20 (2) provide to all county treasurers-a *an electronic mail address or* 21 toll-free telephone number where applicants can call the alumni 22 association or foundation for information concerning the application 23 process or the status of their license plate application.

(k) Each educational institution's alumni association or foundation,
with the approval of the director of vehicles and subject to the availability
of materials and equipment, shall design a license plate to be issued under
the provisions of this section.

(1) As a condition of receiving the educational institution license plate
and any subsequent registration renewal of such plate, the applicant must
provide consent to the division authorizing the division's release of motor
vehicle record information, including the applicant's name, address,
emblem use royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle type to the
relevant educational institution and the state treasurer.

34 (m) Annual royalty payments collected by county treasurers under 35 this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the 36 provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. In the case of an 37 educational institution that is a state educational institution as defined by 38 K.S.A. 76-711, and amendments thereto, upon receipt of each such 39 remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state 40 treasury to the credit of the appropriate account of the restricted fees fund of such state educational institution. In the case of an educational 41 institution which is not a state educational institution as defined by K.S.A. 42 43 76-711, and amendments thereto, upon receipt of each such remittance, the

state treasurer shall remit the entire amount to the educational institutions 1 2 emblem royalty fund, which is hereby created in the state treasury and shall be administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures from the 3 educational institutions emblem royalty fund shall be made in accordance 4 with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and 5 6 reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the state treasurer or the 7 state treasurer's designee. Payments from the educational institutions emblem royalty fund to the respective educational institutions shall be 8 9 made on a monthly basis.

10 New Sec. 3. (a) On and after January 1, 2020, any owner or lessee of one or more passenger vehicles or trucks registered for a gross weight 11 12 of 20,000 pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance with the provisions of this section, may be issued one proud educator 13 license plate for each such passenger vehicle or truck. Such license 14 15 plates shall be issued for the same time as other license plates upon 16 proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided in 17 K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and either the payment to the 18 county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment established by the 19 Kansas educators support foundation or the presentation of the annual 20 logo use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b).

21 The Kansas educators support foundation may authorize the *(b)* 22 use of its proud educator logo to be affixed on license plates as provided 23 by this section. Any royalty payment received pursuant to this section shall be used to support the Kansas educators support foundation. Any 24 25 motor vehicle owner or lessee annually may apply to the Kansas educators support foundation for the use of such logo. Upon payment to 26 27 either: (1) The Kansas educators support foundation in an amount of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 as a logo use royalty payment for 28 each license plate to be issued, the Kansas educators support foundation 29 30 shall issue to the motor vehicle owner or lessee, without further charge, 31 a logo use authorization statement, which shall be presented by the 32 motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time of registration; or (2) the 33 county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment for each license plate to 34 be issued.

35 (c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may 36 make application for such plates not less than 60 days prior to such 37 person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and 38 furnished by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license plate shall either provide the annual logo use authorization statement 39 provided for in subsection (b) or pay to the county treasurer the logo use 40 royalty payment established by the Kansas educators support 41 42 foundation. Application for registration of a passenger vehicle or truck 43 and issuance of the license plate under this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon
 forms furnished by the director.

3 (d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall 4 be transferable to any other person.

5 (e) The director of vehicles may transfer proud educator license 6 plates from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

7 (f) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made, 8 annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No 9 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such 10 applicant either provides to the county treasurer the annual logo use 11 authorization statement provided for in subsection (b) or the payment of 12 the logo use royalty payment as established by the Kansas educators 13 support foundation. If such logo use authorization statement is not 14 presented at the time of registration or faxed by the Kansas educators 15 16 support foundation, or the annual logo use royalty payment is not made to the county treasurer at the time of registration, the applicant shall be 17 required to comply with K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and 18 19 return the license plate to the county treasurer of such person's 20 residence.

21 (g) The Kansas educators support foundation shall:

(1) Pay the initial cost of design for license plates authorized by this
 section; and

(2) provide to all county treasurers a toll-free telephone number or
electronic mail address where applicants can contact the Kansas
educators support foundation for information concerning the
application process or the status of their license plate application.

(h) The Kansas educators support foundation, with the approval of
 the director of vehicles and subject to the availability of materials and
 equipment, shall design a plate to be issued under the provisions of this
 section.

(i) As a condition of receiving the proud educator license plate and
 any subsequent registration renewal of such plate, the applicant must
 provide consent to the division authorizing the division's release of
 motor vehicle record information, including the applicant's name,
 address, logo use royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle
 type to the Kansas educators support foundation and the state treasurer.

(j) Annual logo use royalty payments collected by county treasurers under this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon *receipt of each such remittance the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the Kansas educators support foundation royalty fund, which is hereby created in the state* 1 treasury and shall be administered by the state treasurer. All 2 expenditures from the Kansas educators support foundation royalty 3 fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon 4 warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to 5 vouchers approved by the state treasurer or the state treasurer's designee. Payments from the Kansas educators support foundation 6 7 royalty fund shall be made on a monthly basis to the Kansas 8 independent college's foundation, unless another designee is made by 9 the Kansas educators support foundation.

New Sec. 4. (a) On and after January 1, 2020, any owner or lessee 10 of one or more passenger vehicles or trucks registered for a gross weight 11 of 20,000 pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance 12 with the provisions of this section, may be issued one alpha kappa alpha 13 license plate for each such passenger vehicle or truck. Such license 14 plates shall be issued for the same time as other license plates upon 15 16 proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided in 17 K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and either the payment to the county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment established by alpha 18 19 kappa alpha or the presentation of the annual logo use authorization 20 statement provided for in subsection (b).

21 (b) Alpha kappa alpha may authorize the use of its logo to be 22 affixed on license plates as provided by this section. Any royalty payment 23 received pursuant to this section shall be used to support alpha kappa 24 alpha. Any motor vehicle owner or lessee annually may apply to alpha 25 kappa alpha for the use of such logo. Upon payment to either: (1) Alpha kappa alpha in an amount of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 as a 26 logo use royalty payment for each license plate to be issued, alpha kappa 27 alpha shall issue to the motor vehicle owner or lessee, without further 28 29 charge, a logo use authorization statement, which shall be presented by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time of registration; or (2) the 30 31 county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment for each license plate to 32 be issued.

33 (c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may 34 make application for such plates not less than 60 days prior to such person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and 35 36 furnished by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license 37 plate shall either provide the annual logo use authorization statement 38 provided for in subsection (b) or pay to the county treasurer the logo use 39 royalty payment established by alpha kappa alpha. Application for registration of a passenger vehicle or truck and issuance of the license 40 plate under this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in a 41 42 manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon forms furnished by 43 the director.

1 (d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall 2 be transferable to any other person.

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(e) The director of vehicles may transfer the alpha kappa alpha license plates from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

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(f) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made 5 6 annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the 7 manner prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such 8 applicant either provides to the county treasurer either the annual logo 9 use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b) or the 10 payment of the logo use royalty payment as established by alpha kappa 11 alpha. If such logo use authorization statement is not presented at the 12 time of registration or faxed by alpha kappa alpha, or the annual logo 13 use royalty payment is not made to the county treasurer at the time of 14 registration, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-143, 15 16 and amendments thereto, and return the license plate to the county treasurer of such person's residence. 17

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(g) Alpha kappa alpha shall:

19 (1) Pay the initial cost of design for license plates authorized by this 20 section; and

(2) provide to all county treasurers an electronic mail address or
 toll-free telephone number where applicants can call alpha kappa alpha
 for information concerning the application process or the status of their
 license plate application.

(h) Alpha kappa alpha, with the approval of the director of vehicles
and subject to the availability of materials and equipment, shall design a
plate to be issued under the provisions of this section.

(i) As a condition of receiving the alpha kappa alpha license plate
and any subsequent registration renewal of such plate, the applicant
must provide consent to the division authorizing the division's release of
motor vehicle record information, including the applicant's name,
address, logo use royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle
type to alpha kappa alpha and the state treasurer.

34 (j) Annual logo use royalty payments collected by county treasurers 35 under this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance 36 with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon 37 receipt of each such remittance the state treasurer shall deposit the 38 entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the alpha kappa alpha 39 royalty fund, which is hereby created in the state treasury and shall be administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures from the alpha 40 kappa alpha royalty fund shall be made in accordance with 41 appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports 42 43 issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the state treasurer or the state

1 treasurer's designee. Payments from the alpha kappa alpha royalty fund

2 to the appropriate designee of alpha kappa alpha shall be made on a

3 monthly basis.

4 New Sec. 5. (a) On and after January 1, 2020, any owner or lessee of one or more passenger vehicles or trucks registered for a gross weight 5 6 of 20,000 pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance 7 with the provisions of this section, may be issued one knights of Columbus license plate for each such passenger vehicle or truck. Such 8 license plates shall be issued for the same time as other license plates 9 upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as 10 provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and either the 11 payment to the county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment 12 established by the knights of Columbus Kansas state council or the 13 presentation of the annual logo use authorization statement provided for 14 15 in subsection (b).

16 (b) The knights of Columbus Kansas state council may authorize the use of its logo to be affixed on license plates as provided by this 17 section. Any royalty payment received pursuant to this section shall be 18 19 used to support the knights of Columbus Kansas state council. Any 20 motor vehicle owner or lessee annually may apply to the knights of Columbus Kansas state council for the use of such logo. Upon annual 21 application and payment to either: (1) The knights of Columbus Kansas 22 23 state council in an amount of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 as a logo use royalty payment for each license plate to be issued, the knights 24 25 of Columbus Kansas state council shall issue to the motor vehicle owner or lessee, without further charge, a logo use authorization statement, 26 which shall be presented by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time 27 28 of registration; or (2) the county treasurer of the logo use royalty 29 payment for each license plate to be issued.

(c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may 30 make application for such plates not less than 60 days prior to such 31 person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and 32 furnished by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license 33 plate shall either provide the annual logo use authorization statement 34 provided for in subsection (b) or pay to the county treasurer the logo use 35 royalty payment established by the knights of Columbus Kansas state 36 37 council. Application for registration of a passenger vehicle or truck and 38 issuance of the license plate under this section shall be made by the 39 owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon 40 forms furnished by the director.

41 (d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall 42 be transferable to any other person.

43 (e) The director of vehicles may transfer the knights of Columbus

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1 license plates from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

(f) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made 2 annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the 3 manner prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No 4 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such 5 applicant either provides to the county treasurer either the annual logo 6 7 use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b) or the payment of the logo use royalty payment as established by the knights of 8 Columbus Kansas state council. If such logo use authorization statement 9 is not presented at the time of registration or faxed by the knights of 10 Columbus Kansas state council, or the annual logo use royalty payment 11 is not made to the county treasurer at the time of registration, the 12 applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A. 8-143, and 13 amendments thereto, and return the license plate to the county treasurer 14 15 of such person's residence.

(g) The knights of Columbus Kansas state council shall:

17 (1) Pay the initial cost of design for license plates authorized by this 18 section; and

19 (2) provide to all county treasurers an electronic mail address or 20 toll-free telephone number where applicants can call the knights of 21 Columbus Kansas state council for information concerning the 22 application process or the status of their license plate application.

(h) The knights of Columbus Kansas state council, with the
 approval of the director of vehicles and subject to the availability of
 materials and equipment, shall design a plate to be issued under the
 provisions of this section.

(i) As a condition of receiving the knights of Columbus license
plate and any subsequent registration renewal of such plate, the
applicant must provide consent to the division authorizing the division's
release of motor vehicle record information, including the applicant's
name, address, logo use royalty payment amount, plate number and
vehicle type to knights of Columbus Kansas state council and the state
treasurer.

34 (j) Annual logo use royalty payments collected by county treasurers 35 under this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon 36 37 receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the 38 entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the knights of 39 Columbus royalty fund, which is hereby created in the state treasury and shall be administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures from the 40 knights of Columbus royalty fund shall be made in accordance with 41 appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports 42 issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the state treasurer or the state 43

1 treasurer's designee. Payments from the knights of Columbus royalty

2 fund to the appropriate designee of the knights of Columbus Kansas
3 state council shall be made on a monthly basis.
