## Substitute for SENATE BILL No. 366

AN ACT concerning occupational regulation; relating to occupational
 licenses for certain applicants; amending K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 48-3406
 and repealing the existing section.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

6 Section 1. K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 48-3406 is hereby amended to read as 7 follows: 48-3406. (a) For the purposes of this section:

8 (1) "Applicant" means an individual who is a military spouse, 9 military servicemember or an individual who has established or intends to 10 establish residency in this state. "Applicant," with respect to law 11 enforcement certification by the Kansas commission on peace officers' 12 standards and training, means an applicant who has met the employment 13 requirement pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5605(a), and amendments thereto.

14 "Complete application" means the licensing body has received all (2)forms, fees, documentation and any other information required or 15 requested by the licensing body for the purpose of evaluating the 16 application, consistent with this section and the rules and regulations 17 18 adopted by the licensing body pursuant to this section. If the licensing 19 body has received all such forms, fees, documentation and any other 20 information required or requested by the licensing body, an application 21 shall be deemed to be a complete application even if the licensing body 22 has not yet received a criminal background report from the Kansas bureau 23 of investigation.

(3) "Licensing body" means an official, agency, board or other entity
of the state which authorizes individuals to practice a profession in this
state and issues a license, registration, certificate, permit or other
authorization to an individual so authorized;.

(2)(4) "Military servicemember" means a *current* member of the
 army, navy, marine corps, air force, air or army national guard of any state,
 coast guard or any branch of the military reserves of the United States; and
 or a former member with an honorable discharge.

32 (3)(5) "Military spouse" means the spouse of an individual who is
 33 currently in active service in any branch of the armed forces of the United
 34 States.

(6) "Private certification" means a voluntary program in which a
 private organization grants nontransferable recognition to an individual

who meets personal qualifications and standards relevant to performing
 the occupation as determined by the private organization.

3 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any licensing body 4 shall<del>:</del>

5 (1)—, upon submission of a-<u>completed</u> *complete* application, issue a 6 license, registration or certification to<u>a nonresident military spouse</u> *an* 7 *applicant*, so that the<u>nonresident military spouse</u> *applicant* may lawfully 8 practice the person's occupation<del>; and</del>

9 (2) upon submission of a completed application within six months 10 following release from military service, issue a license, registration or 11 certification to a military servicemember with an honorable discharge so 12 that the military servicemember may lawfully practice the military 13 servicemember's occupation.

(c) A military servicemember with an honorable discharge ornonresident military spouse An applicant who holds a valid current
license, registration or certification in another state, district or territory of
the United States shall receive a license, registration or certification under
subsection (b) of this section:

19 (1) If the applicant qualifies under the applicable Kansas licensure, registration or certification by endorsement, reinstatement or reciprocity 20 statutes, then pursuant to applicable licensure, registration or certification 21 by endorsement, reinstatement or reciprocity statutes of the licensing body 22 of this state for the profession license, registration or certification within 23 60 15 days from the date a complete application was submitted if the 24 applicant is a military servicemember or military spouse or within 45 days 25 from the date a complete application was submitted for all other 26 27 applicants; or

28 (2) *if the applicant does not qualify under the applicable licensure,* 29 registration or certification by endorsement, reinstatement or reciprocity statutes of the licensing body of this state, or if the Kansas professional 30 practice act does not have licensure, registration or certification by 31 endorsement, reinstatement or reciprocity statutes, then the applicant shall 32 receive a license, registration or certification as provided herein if, at the 33 time of application, the military servicemember or nonresident military-34 35 spouse applicant:

36 (A) Holds a valid current license, registration or certification in 37 another state, district or territory of the United States with licensure, 38 registration or certification requirements that the licensing body 39 determines are substantially equivalent to those established by the licensing body of this state, or holds a certification issued by another state 40 for practicing the occupation but this state requires an occupational 41 license, and the licensing body determines that the certification 42 43 requirements are substantially equivalent to the licensing requirements

1 established by the licensing body of this state;

2 (B) has not committed an act in any jurisdiction that would have 3 constituted grounds for the limitation, suspension or revocation *of the* 4 *license, certificate or registration,* or that the applicant has never been 5 censured or had other disciplinary action taken or had an application for 6 licensure, registration or certification denied or refused to practice an 7 occupation for which the military servicemember or nonresident military 8 spouse applicant seeks licensure, registration or certification;

9 (C) has not been disciplined by a licensing, registering, certifying or other credentialing entity in another jurisdiction and is not the subject of 10 an unresolved complaint, review procedure or disciplinary proceeding 11 12 conducted by a licensing, registering, certifying or other credentialing entity in another jurisdiction nor has surrendered their membership on any 13 professional staff in any professional association or society or faculty for 14 15 another state or jurisdiction while under investigation or to avoid adverse 16 action for acts or conduct similar to acts or conduct-which that would 17 constitute grounds for disciplinary action in a Kansas practice act;

(D) does not have a disqualifying criminal record as determined by
 the licensing body of this state under Kansas law;

20 (E) provides proof of solvency, financial standing, bonding or 21 insurance if required by the licensing body of this state, but only to the 22 same extent as required of any applicant with similar credentials or 23 experience;

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(F) pays any fees required by the licensing body of this state; and

(E)(G) submits with the application a signed affidavit stating that the application information, including necessary prior employment history, is true and accurate.

28 Upon receiving such affidavit a complete application, the licensing 29 body shall issue the license, registration or certification within 60 15 days from the date a complete application was submitted by a military 30 31 servicemember or military spouse, or within 45 days from the date a 32 complete application was submitted by an applicant who is not a military 33 servicemember or military spouse, to the military servicemember or 34 nonresident military spouse applicant on a probationary basis, but may 35 revoke the license, registration or certification at any time if the 36 information provided in the application is found to be false. Any The 37 probationary license issued under this subsection to a military 38 servicemember or nonresident military spouse period shall not exceed six 39 months. Upon completion of the probationary period, the license, certification or registration shall become a non-probationary license, 40 41 certification or registration.

42 (d) Any-person *applicant* who has not been in the active practice of 43 the occupation during the two years preceding the application for which

the applicant seeks a license, registration or certification *under subsections* 1

2 (b) and (c) may be required to complete such additional testing, training, mentoring, monitoring or *continuing* education as the Kansas licensing 3 body may deem necessary to establish the applicant's present ability to 4 practice with reasonable skill and safety in a manner that protects the 5 6 health, safety and welfare of the public, as provided by subsection (k).

7 (e) A nonresident military spouse Upon submission of a complete 8 application, an applicant shall receive an occupational license, 9 registration or certification under subsection (b) based on the applicant's work experience in another state, if the applicant: 10

Worked in a state that does not use an occupational license, 11 (1)12 registration or certification to regulate an occupation, but this state uses an occupational license, registration or certification to regulate the 13 14 occupation;

15 (2) worked for at least three years in the occupation during the four 16 years immediately preceding the application; and 17

(3) satisfies the requirements of subsection (c)(2)(B) through (G).

(f) Upon submission of a complete application, an applicant shall 18 19 receive an occupational license, registration or certification under subsection (b) based on the applicant's holding of a private certification 20 21 and work experience in another state, if the applicant:

22 (1) Holds a private certification and worked in a state that does not 23 use an occupational license or government certification to regulate an occupation, but this state uses an occupational license or government 24 25 certification to regulate the occupation;

(2) worked for at least two years in the occupation;

*(3) holds a current and valid private certification in the occupation;* 

28 (4) is held in good standing by the organization that issued the 29 private certification; and

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(5) satisfies the requirements of subsection (c)(2)(B) through (G).

(g) An applicant licensed, registered or certified under this section 31 shall be entitled to the same rights and subject to the same obligations as 32 are provided by the licensing body for Kansas residents, except that 33 revocation or suspension of a nonresident military spouse's an applicant's 34 35 license, registration or certificate in the nonresident military spouse's applicant's state of residence or any jurisdiction in which the nonresident 36 37 military spouse applicant held a license, registration or certificate shall 38 automatically cause the same revocation or suspension of such-nonresident 39 military spouse's applicant's license, registration or certificate in Kansas. No hearing shall be granted to a nonresident military spouse an applicant 40 where such-nonresident military spouse's applicant's license, registration 41

or certificate is subject to such automatic revocation or suspension, except 42

43 for the purpose of establishing the fact of revocation or suspension of the nonresident military spouse's applicant's license, registration or certificate
 by the nonresident military spouse's applicant's state of residence.

(f)(h) In the event the licensing body determines that the license, 3 registration or certificate currently held by the military servicemember or 4 nonresident military spouse an applicant under subsection (c)(2)(A) who 5 6 is a nonresident military spouse or nonresident military servicemember is 7 not substantially equivalent to those issued by the licensing body of this 8 state, the licensing body-may shall issue a temporary permit for a limited period of time to allow the military servicemember or nonresident military 9 spouse applicant to lawfully practice the military servicemember's or 10 nonresident military spouse's applicant's occupation while completing any 11 12 specific requirements that are required in this state for licensure, registration or certification that-was were not required in the state, district 13 or territory of the United States in which the military servicemember or 14 15 nonresident military spouse applicant was licensed, registered, certified or 16 otherwise credentialed.

17 (i) In the event the licensing body determines that the license, registration or certification currently held by an applicant under 18 19 subsection (c)(2)(A) who is not a nonresident military spouse or nonresident military servicemember is not substantially equivalent to 20 21 those issued by the licensing body of this state, the licensing body may 22 issue a temporary permit for a limited period of time to allow the 23 applicant to lawfully practice the applicant's occupation while completing any specific requirements that are required in this state for licensure, 24 registration or certification that was not required in the state, district or 25 26 territory of the United States in which the applicant was licensed, 27 registered, certified or otherwise credentialed.

28 (i) In the event that the licensing body determines that the private 29 certification or work experience currently held by the applicant under subsection (e) or (f) is not sufficient to establish the applicant's present 30 ability to practice in a manner that protects the health, safety and welfare 31 of the public, the applicant may be required to complete such additional 32 33 testing, training, monitoring or continuing education as the licensing body deems necessary. The applicant shall be issued a temporary permit for a 34 limited period of time to allow the applicant to lawfully practice the 35 occupation while completing any specific requirements unless the 36 37 licensing body finds, based on specific grounds, that issuing a temporary permit would jeopardize the health, safety and welfare of the public. 38

(k) Any testing, continuing education or training requirements
administered under subsection (d), (h), (i) or (j) shall be limited to Kansas
law that regulates the occupation and that are materially different from or
additional to the law of another state, or shall be limited to any materially
different or additional body of knowledge or skill required for the

1 occupational license, registration or certification in Kansas.

7 (m) Nothing in this section shall be construed to apply in conflict 8 with or in a manner inconsistent with federal law or a multistate compact, or a rule or regulation or a reciprocal or other applicable statutory 9 provision that would allow an applicant to receive a license. Nothing in 10 this section shall be construed as prohibiting a licensing body from 11 denying any application for licensure, registration or certification, or 12 declining to grant a temporary or probationary license, if the licensing 13 body determines that granting the application may endanger the health, 14 15 safety and welfare of the public.

(h)(n) Each licensing body-may shall adopt rules and regulations
 necessary to implement and carry out the provisions of this section.

18 (i)(o) This section shall not apply to the practice of law or the 19 regulation of attorneys pursuant to K.S.A. 7-103, and amendments thereto.

20 (p) This section shall apply to all licensing bodies not excluded under 21 subsection (o), including, but not limited to:

(1) The abstracters' board of examiners;

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(2) the board of accountancy;
(3) the board of adult care home administrators;

25 (4) the secretary for aging and disability services, with respect to

26 K.S.A. 65-5901 et seq. and 65-6503 et seq., and amendments thereto;

- 27 (5) the Kansas board of barbering;
- 28 (6) the behavioral sciences regulatory board;
- 29 (7) the Kansas state board of cosmetology;
- 30 (8) the Kansas dental board;
- 31 *(9) the state board of education;*
- 32 (10) the Kansas board of examiners in fitting and dispensing of 33 hearing instruments;
- 34 *(11)* the board of examiners in optometry;
- 35 (12) the state board of healing arts;
- (13) the secretary of health and environment, with respect to K.S.A.
  82a-1201 et seq., and amendments thereto;
- (14) the commissioner of insurance, with respect to K.S.A. 40-241
   and 40-4901 et seq., and amendments thereto;
- 40 (15) the state board of mortuary arts;
- 41 (16) the board of nursing;
- 42 (17) the state board of pharmacy;
- 43 (18) the Kansas real estate commission;

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- 1 (19) the real estate appraisal board;
  - (20) the state board of technical professions; and
  - (21) the state board of veterinary examiners.

4 (q) All proceedings pursuant to this section shall be conducted in 5 accordance with the provisions of the Kansas administrative procedure act 6 and shall be reviewable in accordance with the Kansas judicial review act.

7 (r) Commencing July 1, 2020, each licensing body listed in 8 subsection (p)(1) through (21) shall provide a report for the period of July 1 through June 30 to the director of legislative research by August 31 of 9 each year, providing information requested by the director of legislative 10 research to fulfill the requirements of this subsection. The director of 11 legislative research shall develop the report format, prepare an analysis of 12 the reports and submit and present the analysis to the office of the 13 governor, the standing committee on commerce, labor and economic 14 development of the house of representatives, the standing committee on 15 16 commerce of the senate, the standing committee on appropriations of the house of representatives and the standing committee on ways and means 17 of the senate by January 15 of the succeeding year. The director's report 18 may provide any analysis that the director deems useful and shall provide 19 the following items for each applicant category of military servicemember, 20 21 military spouse and non-military individual:

(1) The number of applications by occupation type received under the
 provisions of this section;

24 (2) the number of applications granted under this section by 25 occupation type, and whether the credential issued was regular or 26 temporary;

(3) the number of applications denied under this section by
occupation type, the reason for denial and whether the denial was for a
regular or temporary credential;

(4) the average time between receipt of the application and
completion of the application by occupation type, whether the credential
was temporary or permanent and whether granted or denied;

(5) the average time between receipt of a complete application and
 issuance of a credential by occupation type and whether a regular or
 temporary credential;

(6) identification of applications by occupation type submitted under
this section where the issuance of credentials or another determination by
the licensing body was not made within the time limitations pursuant to
this section, the reasons for the failure to meet such time limitations and
whether the credentials were regular or temporary;

(7) the number of applications received by occupation type where the
applicant was previously censured, the recipient of disciplinary action or
was subject to a limitation, suspension or revocation of a prior credential;

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2 (8) the number of applications granted by occupation type where the 3 applicant was previously censured, the recipient of disciplinary action or 4 was subject to a limitation, suspension or revocation of a prior credential,

- 5 and whether the credential was issued on a temporary or regular basis.
- 6 All information shall be provided by the licensing body to the director 7 of legislative research in a manner that maintains the confidentiality of all 8 applicants and in aggregate form that does not permit identification of 9 individual applicants.
- 10 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 48-3406 is hereby repealed.
- 11 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 12 publication in the statute book.
