AN ACT concerning cities; relating to a board of public utilities; limiting 1 2 the amount of fees included on a utility bill; amending K.S.A. 13-3 1223a, 13-1227 and 13-1228 and repealing the existing sections. 4 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 6 New Section 1. In addition to the customer charge for the provision 7 of sewer, water and electric service, a customer of a board of public utilities shall not be assessed an amount of fees or charges that exceeds 8 9 15% of the combined charges for the provision of such sewer, water and 10 electric service. 11 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 13-1223a is hereby amended to read as follows: 13-12 1223a. Except as provided in section 1, and amendments thereto, the board 13 of public utilities-shall, at the direction of the governing body of the city, shall bill, collect and enforce collection of sewer service charges through 14 the administrative departments of the board in accordance with rules and 15 16 regulations and on terms and conditions established by the governing body 17 of the city. K.S.A. 13-1227 is hereby amended to read as follows: 13-18 Sec. 3. 19 1227. (a) Except as provided in section 1, and amendments thereto, the 20 board of public utilities shall fix reasonable rates for water furnished to 21 consumers-which that will:

(1) Will-Secure an income sufficient to pay all salaries and wages of
all officers and employees in such departments;

(2) will cover the cost of all materials and supplies used in the
operation of the plant;

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- (3) will-cover the cost of all repairs;
- (4) will-cover all miscellaneous expenses;

(5) will-pay the principal of and the interest on all revenue bond
indebtedness of the city incurred for the purpose of purchasing, improving
or extending the waterworks, and will provide a sinking fund sufficient to
pay the principal of and the interest on such indebtedness at maturity; and

(6) will-cover the cost of all repairs and renewals of the plant and all
material used, together with a reasonable allowance for emergency and
unforeseen expenses.

35 *(b)* Upon direction of the city, the board shall install, repair, replace 36 and remove fire hydrants at a reasonable cost determined by the city and

shall provide an adequate water supply through such hydrants at a 1 2 reasonable cost determined by the city. The city may fix special rates for 3 water furnished to the city for public purposes, or to organized institutions 4 of charity.

5 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 13-1228 is hereby amended to read as follows: 13-6 1228. (a) Except as provided in section 1, and amendments thereto, the 7 board of public utilities shall fix reasonable rates for electricity furnished 8 to consumers which that will

9 (1) Will-Secure an income sufficient to pay all salaries and wages of 10 all officers and employees in such department;

(2) will cover the cost of all materials and supplies used in the 11 12 operation of the plant; (3) will-cover the cost of all repairs;

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(4) will-cover all miscellaneous expenses;

(5) will pay the principal of and the interest on all revenue bond 15 16 indebtedness of the city incurred for the purpose of purchasing, improving 17 or extending the electric-light plant and will provide a sinking fund 18 sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such indebtedness at 19 maturity; and

20 (6) will-cover the cost of all repairs and renewals of the plant and all 21 material used, together with a reasonable allowance for emergency and 22 unforeseen expenses.

23 (b) Upon direction of the city, the board shall install, repair, maintain 24 and replace street lighting equipment and traffic signal equipment at a 25 reasonable cost determined by the city, and shall provide an adequate supply of electricity to such street lights and traffic signals at a reasonable 26 27 cost determined by the city. The city may fix special rates for electricity 28 furnished to the city for public purposes.

29 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 13-1223a, 13-1227 and 13-1228 are hereby repealed.

Sec. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 30 publication in the statute book. 31
