**HB 2735**, AN ACT concerning economic development; enacting the right-to-start act; relating to tax incentives for new businesses; reducing the first \$100,000 of new business income included in a taxpayer's Kansas adjusted gross income by 20% for the first three tax years the taxpayer's business is in operation; reducing the income tax on eligible new corporations to 3% for the first three years of such eligible corporation for the first \$100,000 of income; requiring the department of administration to make certain reports to the legislature; establishing the office of entrepreneurship within the department of commerce; amending K.S.A. 2021 Supp. 79-32,110, as amended by section 15 of 2022 Senate Bill No. 347, and repealing the existing section.
