My name is Randy Lopez, from Kansas City, Kansas and I oppose this bill HB2717 because I believe in loving and embracing our neighbors and all in our community; to provide a safe place for all, and to not live in fear.

Wyandotte County continues to be one of the most diverse communities in the country; these are families that want to be here and that love our community. Families who have helped to strengthen the economy, helped to create jobs, helped to redevelop and revitalize our community.

However, many of these families continue to live in the shadows and in fear because of fear mongering and hate, from discrimination and prejudice. HB2717 continues to push that fear into communities. This bill would ask our law enforcement to act as enforcers of immigration law and perpetuates the distrust that we are working on.
