At a time when both the supply and demand sides of the child care sector are facing significant challenges, HB 2414 will enable employers to tap into the underutilized tax benefits to support their employees. This is a win for all Kansans – employers, employees and children.

Child care is a key component to a healthy workforce. Parents need reliable, quality care to enter and remain in the workforce. Children thrive when given reliable, high-quality care. Parents are able to advance their careers and create better lives when they know their children are receiving the care and education they need; and employers save money when they aren't facing constant vacancies and a revolving workforce due to parents struggling with child care cost and availability. Furthermore, the child care industry – as employers themselves – would also be fortified by a boost in steady enrollment if care is cost-shared by parents' employers.
