Subject: Request From Blue Rapids American Legion Post 169 to name the highway connecting Blue Rapids KS and Waterville Kansas for two local service men, Sp4 Gene Meyers of Waterville and Cpl Allen Oatney of Blue Rapids, who gave their lives for our country while serving in Vietnam 51 years ago this June.

Mr. Chairman,

This is not the first time you have entertained our request so I will be brief and only emphasize the key points.

51 years have passed. Now most of our legion members are Vietnam Era Veterans. We can all agree that it was an egregious war, and the treatment of returning service members was as well. They did not receive the support or gratitude from our people at home as was the norm for previous wars.

We have done our part with this endeavor and now we are asking the State to stand with us and pass the necessary Bill.
