## MEMORANDUM

SB 313 designates a portion of United States highway 69 as the Senator Tom R Van Sickle memorial highway, a bridge on K-126 highway as the Dennis Crain memorial bridge, and a portion of United States highway 69 as the AMM2c Walter Scott Brown memorial highway.

Section 1 provides that the Senator Tom R Van Sickle memorial highway will begin on the portion of U.S. 69 from the northern junction of U.S. 69 with U.S. 54 in Bourbon County then will go north on U.S. 69 to the Linn County line.

Section 2 provides that the Dennis Crain memorial bridge will be Bridge No. 19-0115 that is located between the intersections of K-126 and north Grand Street and K-126 with north Rouse Street in Pittsburg.

Section 3 provides that the AMM2c Walter Scott Brown memorial highway begins on the portion of U.S. 69 from the northern junction of U.S. 69 and K-52 highway in Linn County then will go south to the southern junction of U.S. 69 with K-52 highway.

Highway and bridge signs designating these memorial highways and bridge will not be placed until the requirements of K.S.A. 68-10,114 are met. K.S.A. 68-10,114 provides that the secretary of transportation should not place any signs designating memorial highways until receiving sufficient funds from gifts and donations to cover the costs of those signs. Additionally, the secretary must receive an additional 50% of the initial cost to pay for future maintenance or replacement costs for the signs.
