I write to you today to voice Laborers Local Union 1290's ("Local 1290") strong opposition to SB 546. Local 1290 represents thousands of Kansas workers' all across Field Representative the State. We voice our opposition today because SB 546 puts all of our members and their families at risk. SB 546 will do two things. First, it will kill thousands of Kansas jobs all across the State. Second, it puts at risk all Kansas drivers and passengers.

> The Kansas trucking industry is vital to the Kansas economy. Anytime I am on the road I see numerous trucks driving on our highways and streets. Passage of SB 546 will keep the trucks on the road but will eliminate the jobs of those currently driving the trucks. Not only is this not safe, but also terrible for the economy. Eliminating these positions will be a detriment to the Kansas economy. Thousands of Kansas workers will have to count on the State to provide them unemployment while they look for a new job.
