The City of Prairie Village appreciates the opportunity to provide testimony in opposition to Senate Bill 24, which would prohibit municipalities from imposing restrictions on a customer's use of energy based upon the source of energy. We support local control and acknowledge that our local elected officials best know their constituents' and communities' needs. We also support a statewide energy plan that directly recognizes and begins addressing these issues.

Prairie Village considers the climate crisis a public policy priority and is committed to exploring ways to better use renewable resources into the future.
